

FAQs about COVID-19 Vaccination Requirements for In-Person Services

Common Questions	Answers to Your Questions
Can I opt out of the COVID-19 vaccination and be tested instead? How often do I need to get the COVID-19 test if I am not vaccinated? Do I need to take COVID tests if I am fully vaccinated?	 SFUSD requires all service providers working in-person at schools to be fully vaccinated. A person is considered "fully" vaccinated two weeks after completing a COVID-19 Vaccine series (1 dose of the J&J vaccine, or 2 doses of the Moderna or Pfizer vaccine), as well as any boosters, consistent with SF DPH guidelines. Those who qualify for a medical or religious exemption must have a negative COVID 19 test administered within 48 hours of the first time entering a school, then weekly. SFUSD does not require COVID-19 testing for individuals who are fully vaccinated.
Do we need to share each person's proof of vaccination or their negative COVID-19 test with SFUSD? How will we inform SFUSD if staff are vaccinated, or if they are being tested?	 Organizations should not send SFUSD any individual's vaccination card or proof of a negative COVID-19 test. By signing your MOU or contract your organization certifies your staff has met these COVID requirements. Your organization is responsible for maintaining records with this information, and SFUSD may audit your records. This is similar to requirements to certify that you have conducted criminal background checks and have TB clearance for each person working with students.
Where can our staff have access to COVID-19 testing every week?	SFUSD does not provide tests for non-SFUSD employees. Public health departments across the SF Bay Area provide information about accessing COVID-19 vaccinations and testing, depending on where people live or work.
Who do we tell if someone tests positive for COVID after providing services at a school?	Your organization is responsible for informing schools about positive tests, and for following SFUSD's Guidelines and Health & Safety Directive, as well as SF Department of Public Health guidelines.
Our organization has multiple MOUs as well as contracts with SFUSD. Do we need to amend all of those? Do we need to do a new Amendment every time the guidelines change?	 An Amendment form is needed only for an MOU executed before August 2021, to update COVID safety requirements. You need to submit only one signed Amendment form for your organization. SFUSD will apply this Amendment to any current MOUs and/or contracts. MOU forms updated fall 2021 include these requirements, and require service providers to comply with SFUSD's guidelines that change based on public health conditions.
