tered service Dec. 14, 1942.

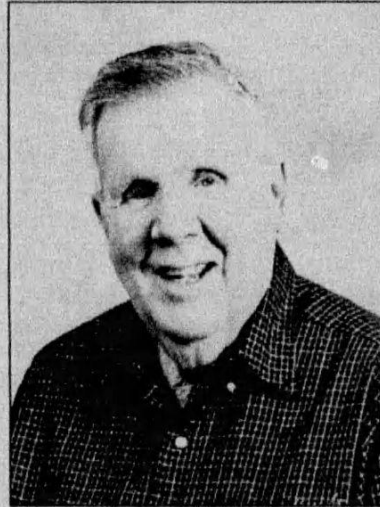
Walsh, Arthur
