

Walt: Create and use appropriate units to measure length

Measurement activities

- Mark up a cardboard strip in centimetres to make a ruler.
- <u>Estimate</u> the length of some objects around your house: scissors, pencils, kitchen utensils or some of your toys.
- <u>Record</u> your estimates.
- Measure the objects with your cardboard ruler. How close were your estimates?
- Go to the activity *<u>Mighty Metres</u> and follow the instructions.
- Go to the activity *<u>Gumboots Away!</u> and follow the instructions.
 - * Note: You will have to get creative with some of the instructions, for example, you will most likely not have a classmate to do these activities with you so you'll have to ask someone in your whanau to work with you. Also, you may not have all the materials needed so just do the best you can with what you have.
