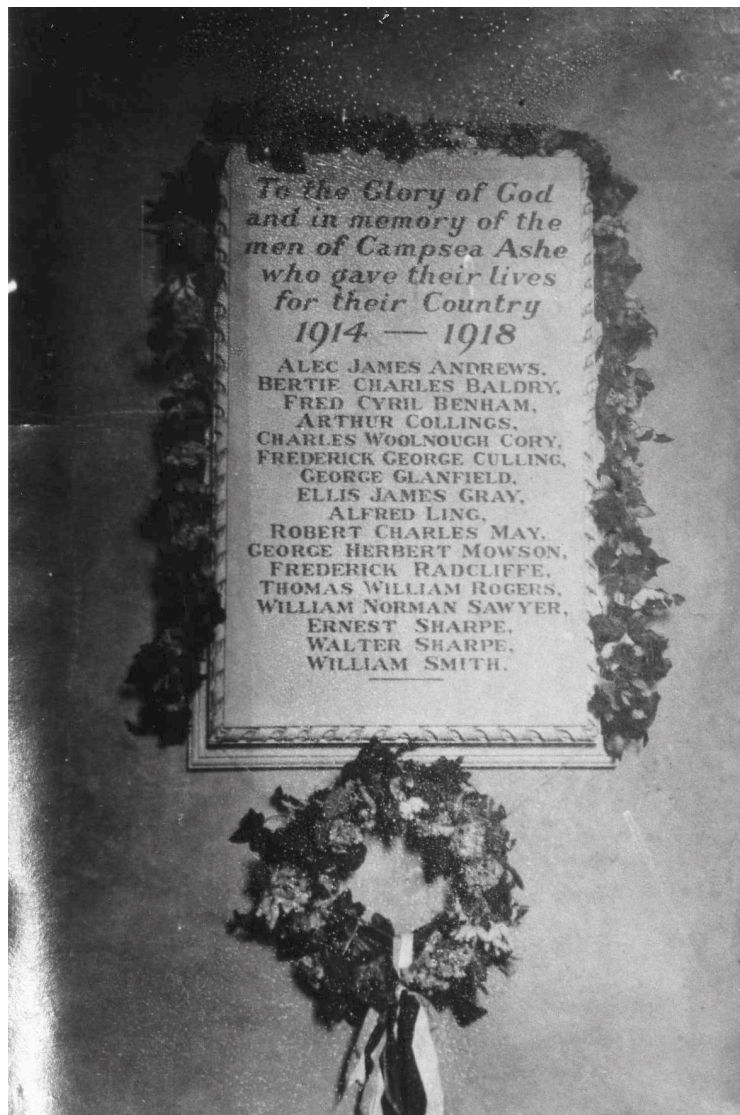




Thomas Rogers

Killed 11 October 1918



Thomas Rogers was born in 1888 the only son of Henry and Jane Rogers of Rendlesham Park. His father was head gardener at the park and also churchwarden at Campsea Ashe. Like his father, Thomas also became a churchwarden as well as singing in the Church choir.

He enlisted and served with the 9th Battalion, Sherwood Foresters (Notts and Derby Regiment), Regimental number 90792. His Battalion was formed in 1914 as part of Kitchener's Army and they served in Gallipoli, Egypt and eventually France where Thomas was killed in action. It is believed he was unmarried, aged 30 years. He is remembered at the Vis-en-Artois Memorial.

9th (Service) Battalion

Formed at Derby in August 1914 as part of K1 and came under orders of 33rd Brigade in 11th (Northern) Division. Moved initially to Grantham. Moved to Frensham in April 1915.

Sailed from Liverpool in early July 1915 for Gallipoli, landing at Suvla Bay 7 August 1915.

Evacuated from Gallipoli December 1915, moved to Egypt via Imbros.

Moved to France in July 1916
