ernicht, ESU 13	<p>The AAAC met via Zoom on August 13th to discuss the following...</p> <p>Q1. If allowed, would your district likely use the ACT flexible scheduling option? What benefits and challenges do you see with offering flexible scheduling for Nebraska school districts?</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Many in attendance mentioned allowing students to take the ACT test over two days would cause much disruption in school schedules due to the need to have a private testing area where other students could not access. Many schools close school for other students during ACT testing. Schools could possibly utilize 1.5 days but most wouldn't utilize a two day scenario. 2. Most felt the flexible option would be great for subgroups of students, but not necessarily best for all. Example: EL Populations 3. 8-20-2025 UPDATE: Trudy emailed out that ACT will not allow subgroups of students to have different testing schedules. All students must have the same schedule. <p>Q2. Districts will have one week to complete data cleanup for NSCAS General and Alternate and the ACT. Do you support removing the June/July days from the summer clean up schedule? What unintended consequences do you see in this change?</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. As many DACs and other pertinent staff are not under contract in the summer months, or a portion of summer, it was discussed that Spring cleanup could occur in August, or even May, rather than July. 2. It was discussed that many smaller districts may like this option, but for some of our state's largest districts the data cleanup takes most of the summer and could not be accomplished in a shorter August window. 3. It was thought NDE could possibly allow both options or leave the window open longer so all could manage what fit their district. <p>No decisions were finalized on either matter.</p>	8-21-2025
