About the Courses	WriteAtHome is an asynchronous program, but students taking their a-g approved courses have the option of recorded or live sessions for the Literature portion. Each week, students have access to a lesson and a writing assignment. Coaches provide feedback on their assignments. (Sample lesson) Wasko Lit and WriteAtHome are popular because they utilize an in-depth, Great Books reading list and can provide detailed feedback on student writing. How to Order/Enroll	Place an order through the Homeschool Hub under the approved vendor "WriteAtHome." Please note in the order whether or not your student has been enrolled with WriteatHome previously. If requesting a Literature course, please indicate whether you are requesting the recorded or live option. Annual courses are only approved if the vendor does not offer a per-semester option.
HST Responsibility	 If your student is taking the course for "a-g" credit, please refer to the A-G Self-Certification/Adoption section of the handbook to ensure your course is self-certified and the course title is added to Pathways. You will receive a teacher account to monitor and support your student. Be sure to monitor student progress and assist students with pacing the course appropriately throughout the semester.



	 Check the course <u>calendar</u> and help your student pace their course <i>according to</i> <i>our school semester deadlines</i>. A few of these dates do not line up so please make sure your student is pacing appropriately.
Progress Monitoring	Teachers can obtain a dashboard login with which to progress monitor their students.
	Grades are suggested within the WriteAtHome program, but the final grade comes from the HST. Special projects are assigned to accommodate the a-g approval, but the HST needs to oversee the implementation of these projects, especially the speaking and listening portions. The HST should be prepared to administer and grade the two special projects using the rubric provided by WriteAtHome.
	The courses are paced according to WriteAtHome's calendar, and the HST should assist the student with pacing the course according to our school calendar. (see HST Responsibility)
Work Sample	Teachers can obtain a student from the dashboard, which uses the Canvas LMS. Teachers have the same access to the student's progress as the parent.
Withdrawing from a Course	Students can receive a prorated (by the month) refund. If a student wishes to withdraw, the parent should contact their homeschool teacher.
IEP or 504 Plan?	No specific accommodations are offered for IEPs or 504s, but parents can provide information to the writing coach using the <u>Special Considerations form</u> . Writing coaches are trained to provide personalized feedback and work with students according to their needs and abilities.
Good To Know	 Write At Home FAQ Students can expect 6-8 hours of work per week for a-g approved courses. The reading schedule is designed to provide approximately one hour of reading per day, four days a week. Please be mindful before ordering this curriculum that the teachers in this program depend on their enrollment numbers. Please order once the family has confirmed this is the curriculum they want.
