Subject: English - Grammar

Grade level: Grade 3

Topic: Nouns

Learning Objectives:

- 1. Students will be able to identify and classify different types of nouns
- 2. Students will be able to use nouns correctly in sentences
- 3. Students will be able to differentiate between singular and plural nouns

Materials:

Examples of different types of nouns (common, proper, collective)

Whiteboard and markers

Noun sorting activity sheets

Worksheets or graphic organizers for noun usage and pluralization

Reference materials (such as a grammar book or chart)

Procedure:

Introduction:

Begin the lesson by asking the students what a noun is and why it is important in language.
