<u>FAFSA</u> (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is now open. The sooner you complete the application, the better.

This is a good resource for National Scholarship Opportunities. The website is updated weekly.

As a reminder, the <u>transcript release form</u> needs to be handed in to your counselor, at least 10 school days before the application deadline. Before you hand in the form, please double check with your teachers that their letters of recommendation have been uploaded to Scoir. These forms need to be directly handed to your counselor. Do not email them, leave them on their desk, or their mailboxes. For example, if your school has a November 1st deadline, the transcript release form needs to be handed directly to your counselor no later than Monday, October 18.

Looking for a job?

<u>Ditschman Flemington Ford – Lincoln</u> has an entry level program available for auto technicians. This program requires no experience, tools, trade school, or college degree and they will be trained on the job.

Below is a brief outline of the program.

Flemington Car & Truck Country Technician Development / Training Program

There will be 4 levels with an overall estimated completion time of 9 months.

The 4 levels will be

Level 1 - oil changes, tire rotations, air filter, wipers, cabin filter. These technicians will be trained on both the one- and two-man process. (estimated 1 month for level completion)

Level 2 - Before moving to level 2, STARS quick lane technician levels 1, 2, & 3 must be successfully completed. Level 2 technicians will be responsible to perform oil change, tire rotation, tire balance, wipers, battery replacement, air filter, tire repair, tire light on, bulbs, alignments, accessories, recalls, Running board issues and cabin filter. (estimated 3 months for level completion)

Level 3 - Before moving to level 3, STARS category courses 40 technician fundamentals, 34 electrical systems, 35 climate control, 33 steering suspension, and 38 brakes must be successfully completed.


Level 3 technicians will be responsible to perform all upsells from level 1 and 2, flushes, light diagnosing, and all SYNC concerns.(estimated 5 months for level completion)

Level 4 - Before moving to level 4, STARS category courses 31 gasoline engine performance, 32 gasoline engine repair and or 51 diesel engine performance, 52 diesel engine repairs must be successfully completed. At this level the technician will be working side by side with a senior master technician. Level 4 technicians will be responsible to perform any automotive repair. Completion of STARS category courses 37 automatic transmission, and 36 manual transmission and drivetrain will be required before performing these types of repairs.

If you have not already submitted your <u>Counselor Recommendation Questionnaire</u> and <u>Parent Questionnaire</u>, please do so ASAP.

Any student who is applying to a college that uses the Self-Reported Academic Record (SRAR) should choose decimal grades for the grade scale.



If you have not already signed up for Scoir please do so ASAP. If you are not sure how to register, please email your counselor.

After October 1, any classes that are dropped will be reflected on the transcript as a withdrawal pass (WP) or a withdrawal fail (WF). If you have any questions, speak with your counselor.
