- The book was poorly written so why was it so addicting? What made us want to keep reading so badly?
- Seeing the movie: Watching the movie for Brigitte before reading the last two have put a new picture of the characters in her head so it will be interesting to see for her whether that changes her reading experience at all.
- Seeing the movie (Amanda): I think the movie was atrocious, honestly. I thought it was an awful attempt at covering the story line of the book. Although the first book of the trilogy was not my favorite, there were definite parts in it that I believed were super important, especially for the rest of the series, that were not explained or shown in the movie at all (for example: 1) the avoxs and the story of Katniss recognizing the avox when she first arrives at the Captiol, 2) Haymitch and Katniss' relationship being underdeveloped-very little signs of how much they actually disliked each other, not much shown about how they had an understanding while in the arena, Haymitch was not as drunk as he was explained to be all the time, 3) Gale and Katniss' relationship was overdeveloped- Gale was being shown as more of a boyfriend to Katniss rather than her friend- the movie made it seem as if she was cheating on Gale with Peeta while in the arena, 4) Rue and Katniss' relationship was underdeveloped- it seemed sort of creepy how Katniss was

so attached to her when she died in the movie. Also the movie didn't capture how Rue reminded Katniss of Prim and that's why she was so attached to her, 5) Cinna and Katniss' relationship was underdeveloped, seemed sort of weird when he kissed her on the forehead before she went into the arena when in the book it was completely normal and almost calming, and 6) The end of the book did not end how the movie did. Peeta and Katniss were not shown to be nearly as injured as they actually were- Peeta did not have a fake leg, and the movie didn't explain how Katniss was faking the relationship with Peeta for the gifts in order to win. It also didn't show how he caught on to that at the end and was very mad/upset about it.

-Overall, I think the movie was such a disappointment and a lot of key points for later in the trilogy were not explained well in the first movie.
