If you opt to take it in 11th grade, you will qualify for a National Merit Scholars.

The Preliminary SAT (PSAT) test is a standardized test that provides practice for the SAT test. It is also a pre-qualifier to enter the National Merit Scholarship Corporation scholarship program, National Achievement Scholarships for Outstanding Black Students, and the National Hispanic Scholar Recognition Program. The PSAT provides feedback on student's strengths and weaknesses for study in college.

While many colleges/universities will post either the minimum ACT or SAT scores that students need for admissions; the majority of these schools will accept either score.

Students can opt to have their scores sent automatically to the college(s) of their choice when they sign up to take the ACT or SAT. Students also have the option to wait to get their scores and send them to the colleges on their own, but there is a fee for this option.

Juniors at LLHS will take the SAT in the Spring.

It is highly recommended to check out the format of the exam and start practicing. What you are learning since freshmen year will be on the exam.

Beyond that, students sign up for the ACT or SAT (or both) on their own (links below). Before you do so, get a fee waiver from your counselor.

The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) is a multi-aptitude test battery consisting of 10 individual tests. Students receive scores on each individual test as well as composite scores based on the combination of individual tests. Composite scores are given in the areas of Verbal, Math, and Academic Ability. Students who would like to join the military need to take the ASVAB. It is also a career exploration test so any student can take it even if they are not interested in the military.

Based on their performance on rigorous AP examinations, students can earn credit, advanced placement, or both for college. Students are strongly encouraged to take the Advanced

Placement exams. Colleges look favorably at transcripts that have AP courses. A Department of Education study reports that participation in AP courses is one of the strongest predictors of college success. AP Courses are open to any student who wishes to enroll.
