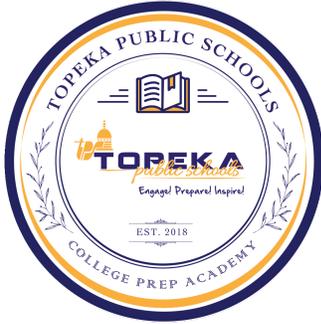

Course Format: In-Person

Class Description:

This is a course designed to give you, the students, an overview of Computer Applications including current terminology, introduction to computer hardware, software applications, and procedures. You will learn and develop skills of these subjects:

- Internet Safety
- Computer Basics
- Computer Parts
- Keyboarding
- Microsoft Word
- PowerPoint

You will develop your understanding of Computer Applications through readings, worksheets, group and individual projects, presentations, quizzes, and tests.

Course Objectives:

1. Students will understand the classroom expectations and rules by going over the syllabus. They will also understand what subjects they will be learning in Computer Applications.
2. Students will become computer and internet savvy with tutorials on how to operate a computer, surf smartly, and guide through the basics of internet, while providing up-to-date information on the latest online tools and technologies.
