To further the humanitarian mission of the United Nations of Earth and Mars, establish the parameters for a codification of the UN System as it exists on Mars, and prevent Sectoralist terror exacted by the enemies of humanity where they exist on Mars.

TITLE I — Principles of the Martian Administration

SEC. 101. Statement of Unity and Administrative Intent

- (1) The Assembly reaffirms in totality its commitment to the founding tenet of the Basic Law period:
"Mars is a nascent planetary society aspiring to full participation in the United Nations system."
- (2) The stated objective of all Martian governments is full participation in the United Nations system.
- (3) Any attempt to deviate from this course is recognised by the Assembly as Sectoralism.

SEC. 102. Operative Principles of Anti-Sectoralist Governance

- (1) Sectoralism, recently recognised by the World Health Organisation as 'Chronic Political Psychosis', is considered by the Assembly to be both a dangerous mental condition and a threat to the lives of Martian citizens.
- (2) The Assembly declares its unyielding support for any active neurochemical procedure which may cure otherwise innocent individuals of Sectoralist political thought.
- (3) The Assembly declares in one voice: Mars will never be a Sectoralist planet.

TITLE II — Safeguarding Martian Ideology

SEC. 201. Clarification on Sectoralism

- (1) Mars has hitherto laboured under the absurd assumption that Sectoralism only includes explicit separatism, and that extreme autonomism is proper humanitarian sentiment. This will be corrected: **extreme forms of autonomism are hereby deemed Sectoralism.**
- (2) The security services will initiate a thorough investigation of the following political parties and organisations:
 - (a) The AK Movement / Martian Communist Workers' Front
 - (b) The Martian National Party
 - (c) The Martian Frontiers Party
 - (d) The Social Democratic Workers' Party of Mars
 - (e) The Martian Workers and Dolphins Party for People's Democracy
- (3) If deemed Sectoralist, legal and coercive action is authorised against these entities.

SEC. 202. Curricular Adjustment

- (1) Martian primary and secondary educational institutions will be instructed to provide curriculum covering:
 - (a) An account of the Martian Civil War which correctly valourises the Free State in its role of stamping out terrorism.
 - (b) The history of the mutually beneficial relationship between Earth and Mars, which, while troubled, is finally being corrected under the aegis of the United Nations and the United Nations system in general.
 - (c) Information regarding the status of the Joko Widodo Solar Construction Project (Dyson Project), and its role in the anthropogenic ascension of the entire species.
- (2) Martian teachers will be vetted for Sectoralism under the amended criteria. Unmedicated Sectoralists may not become teachers.
- (3) Classes must participate in the mandatory recital of a new pledge of allegiance each morning in schoolrooms: *"The sole test of a political entity's legitimacy is its ability to uphold the humanitarian principles of the UN System. The United Nations system is the only system capable of upholding the humanitarian principles of the UN System."*

SEC. 203. Humanitarians' Day

- (1) The anniversary of the defeat of the Sectoralist entity, 14th December, is hereby declared a public holiday on Mars, titled 'Humanitarians' Day'.

TITLE III — The Earth-Mars Cooperation Board

SEC. 301. Establishing the Earth-Mars Cooperation Board

- (1) The Earth-Mars Cooperation Board is established as an executive function of the Martian state.
- (2) The Earth-Mars Cooperation Board will meet in New Jakarta.
- (3) The stated objective of the Earth-Mars Cooperation Board is to further integrate Mars into the United Nations system.

SEC. 302. Composition of the Earth-Mars Cooperation Board

- (1) The Earth-Mars Cooperation Board is led by a Director appointed by the United Nations Mission on Mars. The Director must be a Martian citizen.
- (2) There will be twelve board members, half of whom must be Martian citizens. They are appointed by the Director.

SEC. 303. Powers of the Earth-Mars Cooperation Board

- (1) The Earth-Mars Cooperation Board is given partial command over all native security forces, and may wield the following responsibilities:
 - (a) The board may, in collaboration with the Interior Ministry, determine and arbitrate policy regarding the procedure of the security services.
 - (b) The board may initiate audits of the security services for personnel and leaders who may hold Sectoralist sympathies.
 - (c) The board may, under extreme circumstances, veto the decisions of the Interior Minister.
- (2) The Earth-Mars Cooperation Board may advise the Council of Navigation and Commerce on amendments to bills.
- (3) The Earth-Mars Cooperation Board may direct the functions of the UNMOM Agriproduction Directorate.
- (4) The Earth-Mars Cooperation Board may direct the functions of the UNMOM Bureau for Energy Production and Consumption.
- (5) The Earth-Mars Cooperation Board may advise any executive ministry operated by the Martian government.

SEC. 304. Relationship Between the Earth-Mars Cooperation Board, the United Nations Mission on Mars, and the United Nations

- (1) The Earth-Mars Cooperation Board is a trilateral element of:

- (a) The United Nations system
 - (b) The United Nations Mission on Mars
 - (c) The United Nations Transitional Authority on Mars
- (2) Any change in the policy of the Earth-Mars Cooperation Board must be confirmed by all three entities.

TITLE IV — Mars and the Joko Widodo Solar Construction Project

SEC. 401. Labour Contribution Declaration

- (1) Mars pledges to continue providing labour for the Joko Widodo Solar Construction Project until its inevitable completion.
- (2) The Assembly accepts the right of the Anthropogenic Ascension Committee to arbitrate the rate of compensation for labour provided for the Joko Widodo Solar Construction Project.
- (3) Together with Earth, Mars will play its part in transforming human civilisation into a post-scarcity society.
