

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

May 21, 2019 Board Meeting

- SRO Vacancy: The Rocky Mountain House R.C.M.P. have informed us that they have identified a suitable candidate for our Rocky Mountain House SRO position that will become vacant at the end of June. This is good news. Hopefully the new SRO will be ready to start in September.
- 2. ASBA Youth Summit The Alberta School Boards Association is partnering with the Mental Health Commission of Canada (MHCC) to bring HEADSTRONG to students from across the province for a two day Provincial Youth Mental Health Summit in Red Deer Alberta on June 3-4, 2019. We have one student from West Central High School and one from Frank Maddock High School planning to attend.
- 3. Health & Safety Committee (HSC) update We are very close to having our HSC variance request approved by the Ministry of Labour. Our remaining steps include:
 - a. Submit the names of our 8 committee members (4 workers and 4 management)
 - Submit the names of the co-chairs for the committee (1 worker and 1 management)
 - c. Submit the names of our Health & Safety Representatives from each of our sites (all workers)

We hope to have all of these positions confirmed and submitted by May 31, 2019. We hope to have an initial start-up meeting for the HSC in June and then quarterly meetings starting the 2019-20 school year. For more information, please see our HSC Terms of Reference.

- 7. Condor Sensory Room Grant: Condor School was successful in acquiring grant monies from the Children's Ability Fund to support the creation of a Sensory Room, specifically a Sensory Magic Starter System Kit.

Honouring Spirit: Indigenous Student Awards: These awards celebrate exceptional students nominated by members of their education communities, based on their exemplary leadership, honour, courage, and commitment to their cultures and education paths.
