

Elementary Math Support Service Criteria		
Service Description	Tier 3 math intervention is provided by acceleration teachers, as well as additional highly trained staff.	
	Students receive services two-to-five days per week during the small group portion of the literacy or math instructional block. Students receiving tier 3 instruction will also receive tier 1 whole group, tier 1 small group, and tier 2 instruction.	
	Groups will be revisited after each benchmarking period. (Winter and Spring)

Service Criteria		
Kindergarten 1st Semester	Students are not identified for math support services during the 1st semester of kindergarten.	
	Criteria for Service:	
Kindergarten 2nd semester	<b>Step 1:</b> Students qualify for services based on theNWEA MAP results. Students who are at or below the 10th percentile will qualify for tier 3 support.	
	<b>Step 2:</b> The team of teachers will review the MAP data, as well as, CFA data to determine if the student will receive tier 3 math support.	
1st Grade	Criteria for Service:	
	<b>Step 1:</b> Students qualify for services based on the MAP results. Students who score at or below the 10th percentile will qualify for tier 3 support.	
	<b>Step 2:</b> The team of teachers will review the MAP data, as well as classroom data to determine if the student will receive tier 3 math support.	
2nd Grade	Criteria for Service:	
	<b>Step 1:</b> Students qualify for services based on the NWEA MAP score and the i-Ready diagnostic results. Students who score below the 10th percentile on MAP will qualify for tier 3 support.	
	<b>Step 2:</b> The team of teachers will review the MAP data and classroom data to determine the support the student will receive for tier 3 math support.	

3rd Grade - 5th grade	Criteria for Service:  Step 1: Students qualify for services based on the NWEA MAP score. Students who score below the 10th percentile on MAP will qualify for tier 3 support.
	Step 2: The team of teachers will review the MAP data and classroom data to determine the support the student will receive for tier 3 math support.
6th-8th Grade	Criteria for Service:
	Step 1: Students qualify for services based on the NWEA MAP score. Students who score below the 10th percentile on NWEA MAP will qualify for tier 3 support.
	Step 2: The team of teachers will review the diagnostic data, MAP data, and classroom data to determine the support the student will receive for tier 3 math support.

Progress Monitoring	Student progress is monitored biweekly using one the progress monitoring tools on i-Ready.
Exit Criteria	The data team will review progress monitoring data and benchmarking data to determine eligibility for exiting tier 3 services.
Communication Documents	Service Eligibility  Service Discontinuation
Reporting	The acceleration teacher will update the classroom teacher and the families on a biweekly basis with information about progress and goals.
