




Alec Andrews

Killed 5th July 1918





Alec James Andrews was born in 1899 at Campsea Ashe. His parents were Alfred and Annie Andrews who had married in Woodbridge in 1887. Alfred was a gardener at the High House (below) working for the Lowther family.

He had at least five brothers and sisters – Charles (b 1889), Winifred (b 1891), Mildred (b 1895), Peter (b 1896) and Donald (b 1900). At the start of the war Alec was only 15 years old, but it is not known when he entered the war.

He served as a rifleman in the 3rd Battalion of the Rifle Brigade (The Prince Consort's Own), service number B/200938, and he was killed in action on the 5th July 1918 aged just 19 or 20 years. He is buried at the Bully-Grenay Communal Cemetery which is in the Pas de Calais area of France. He was awarded the Victory and British medals, presumably posthumously, but it looks as though his family did not receive them as a note on his medal record says "*O i/c Recs requests auth to dispose of medals*".
