We Three Kings

Kings, Magi, Wise Men... they are all names used to describe the people in *Matthew 2:1-12* who brought their best gifts to Jesus. Are you bringing your best gifts, too? Let's take a look at four other things these wise men did to find something worth looking for.

1. They SOUGHT

Genuine seekers are always looking around, asking questions, and doing whatever they have to do to find the answer. How about you? In what ways do you seek? Have you grown numb to your surroundings? Do you want to make a journey to find truth?

2. They SAW

God put the stars in the sky. He doesn't hide them; He puts them in plain sight. Lost people matter. No matter how far you feel from God, you still matter, and He will still put stars, signs, clues, etc. in front of you. What is something you saw this week that reminded you of God?

3. They SURRENDERED

Jesus didn't come to solve a problem; He came to be a Savior. What does surrendering mean to you? Have you surrendered your life to God? Do you examine yourself/your obedience daily?

4. They SAVORED

You will never fully experience the joy of Jesus until you grasp the joylessness of living without Him. How do you savor the love of Jesus?

Colossians 3:16; Luke 15:1-32

- Be intentional this week. Ask God to open your eyes daily to see the stars that He is putting in your sky.
- Pray daily that God will help you be obedient to what He is calling you to do for that day.
- Savor the moments of joy, and remember where joy comes from.
