

COMMUNITY LETTER FROM SAD #46/AOS#94 SUPERINTENDENT – Kevin T. Jordan

RE: COVID-19 POSITIVE CASES IN SAD #46

This letter is to inform you that thirty-one (31) individuals associated with SAD #46 have tested positive for COVID-19 this week. Based on Universal Masking Guidelines in place, Pooled Testing, and vaccinations, zero (0) additional individuals are now in quarantine. We have taken steps with our response team to follow the updated Maine CDC and DOE guidelines to notify staff and students as appropriate. We believe it best to share what we can with our entire community.

COVID-19 is a respiratory illness that ranges from mild to severe. It can be more severe in adults 60 years and older and in those with underlying health conditions. The virus mainly spreads when an infected person coughs or sneezes and an uninfected person breathes in the virus. Signs and symptoms include:

- fever / chills
- cough
- shortness of breath / difficulty breathing
- fatigue
- muscle / body aches
- headache
- new loss of taste / smell
- congestion / runny nose
- nausea / vomiting
- diarrhea
- sore throat

Please keep in mind that many things can cause respiratory illness, so students (and staff) should be up-to-date on influenza and routine vaccinations.

Maine CDC recommends prevention measures to help control the spread of COVID-19. These measures include proper handwashing with soap and warm water, which is especially important after using the bathroom, before / after eating, after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing. When soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands and avoid close contact with people who are sick. Cover your cough or sneeze into a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash. Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces and objects using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
