1*. What is your all time favorite movie?

Do you make personal associations with the movie?

Do you see the movies purpose or meaning?

Does the movie inspire you?

2. Select a movie that you like and identify and define:

1. the three discrete stages: development, production and distribution, in a motion picture project.
2. Within the production stage there are also three clearly defined sequential phases — pre-production, principal photography and post-production.
 - a. Distinctions are also made between above-the-line personnel (such as the director, the screenwriter and the producers) who begin their involvement during the project's development stage, and
 - b. the below-the-line "technical" crew involved only with the production stage.
3. Name the Director of a movie.
4. Name an Iconic Landmark used in a film.
5. Name a Song played during a movie.
6. Producer - Name any Producer on the film Composer.
7. Name the Composer on the film Award - Is your film Oscar worthy?
8. Name an Award the film won.
9. Name a Writer or Author credited on the film.
10. Name the year when film was released
11. Name a memorable prop in the film (i.e. lightsaber or Indy's whip).

3. What is an actor or actress? What is a character actor or actress? Select 4 movies and identify the leading actor or actress and the character actor or actress in each movie.

4. What Is A Genre?

Each genre is different and entails a different meaning through categories of interest.

When you are a movie buff, there probably isn't a genre out there that doesn't contain a movie you dislike. You will never know what types of movies interest you unless you try them. Watch a movie from a genre you haven't seen before. What do you think of the movie? Discuss with your troop what new things you learned.

5*. Have you ever read or heard a movie review? Do you love watching movies? You show up early and mentally note each coming attraction you'd like to see — which is most of them. You and your friends discuss the film's best, worst, and most intriguing aspects. If this sounds like you, you might already be a film critic at heart. You will find everything you need to know about writing a movie review here:

After the movie and the review time with your friends, sit down and start your review. It takes effort to structure your thoughts, so it's good to have a place to start. Film criticism is an art form — there are no templates to follow. But there are a few facts that anyone reading your review should take away: Who directed the movie? Who starred in it? Is it a sequel, adaptation, or remake?

Film classification in the United States is a voluntary process with the ratings issued by the Motion Picture Association of America via the Classification and Rating Administration. When was this system established and how does it work? What are the ratings and what do they mean?

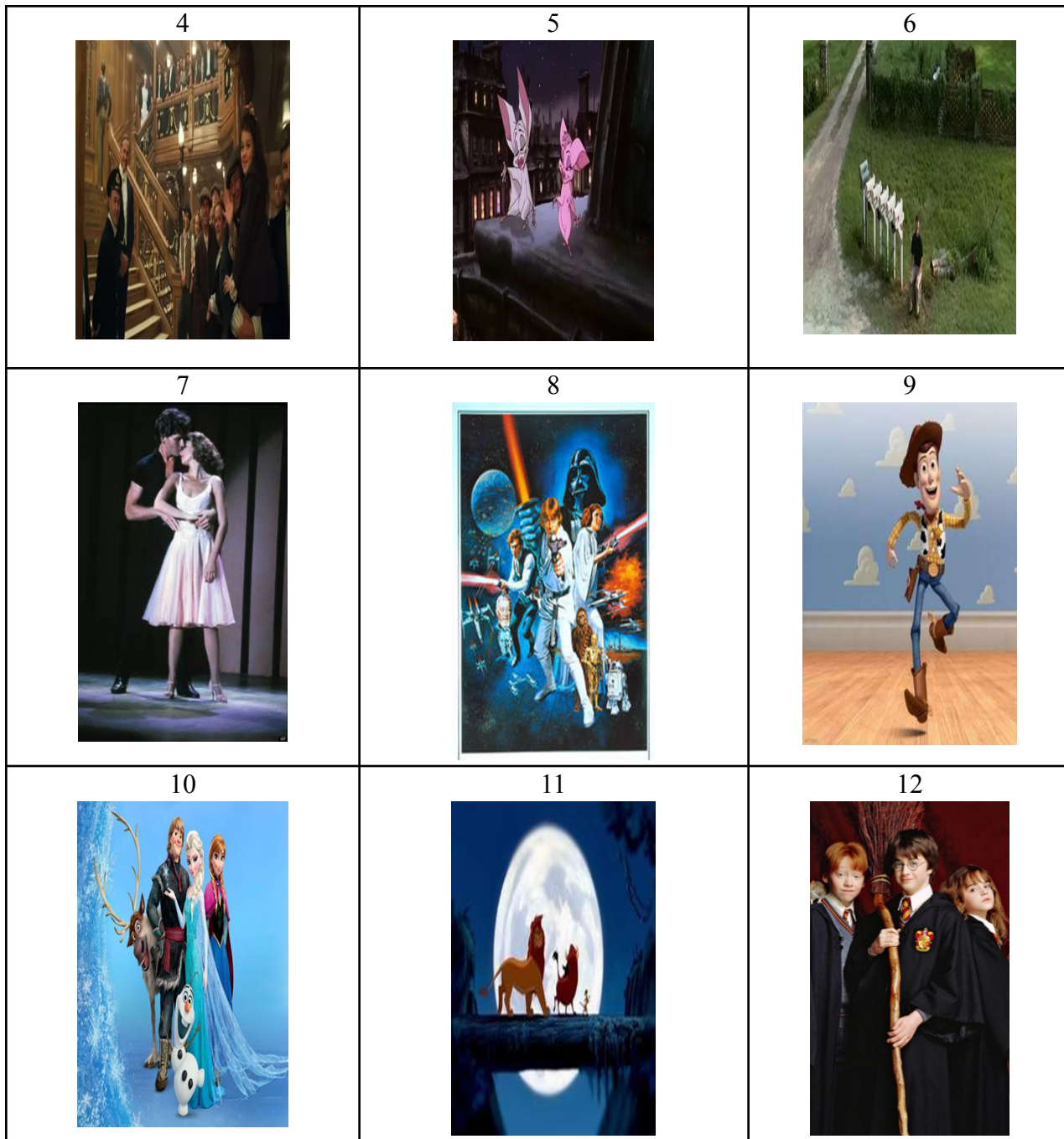
