Check out <u>this google sheet</u> for all sources to look at including national/ sub national policies. The google sheet also has links to the timeline, country overview and data tracker sheet.

It is useful to use the timeline sheet, to keep track of what policies you have coded when working with another RA so you don't double code policies on the same day, highlight in yellow which ones haven't been entered into the Shiny App and then green for those who have so the other RA can cross check and see that it has been coded or not.¹
