ARRANGEMENTS

This is a space to discuss and publish logistics for a meeting of the TEI Technical Council to be held in Ann Arbor, Michigan 28-30 May, 2015

Dates

Confirmed dates are Thursday 28 May through Saturday, 30 May, 2015. That is, we will meet on those days. Council members will normally arrive in Ann Arbor on the preceding day (Wednesday 27 May), and may of course stay on an extra night and leave on Sunday 31 May.

Weather

We are expecting typical 'summery' weather. Wednesday-Thursday will be warm and moist, temperatures 60-85 F (15-30 C or 302 K!), with thunderstorms likely late. Friday and Saturday may dry out and cool down to 50-70 F (10-21 C). [in the event, Thu - Fri were warm and humid; Saturday noon it began to rain, and then rained fairly steadily for the next 24 hours, accompanied by an abrupt cool-down to ca. 48 deg F]

Lodging

Paul has had the UM Library administration reserve a block of ten rooms at the <u>Bell Tower</u> <u>Hotel</u> on Thayer Street immediately north of North University, for the nights of 27 May through 30 May, on the assumption that any or all could elect to arrive a day early and leave a day late. Council members have been polled as to their actual arrival and departure dates, and the reservations have been made accordingly. The University has paid for all the rooms and will be reimbursed by TEI.

Meeting Space

Paul has reserved the **Turkish American Friendship room** on the fourth floor of Shapiro Library for business hours on May 28 and May 30. For Friday the 29th, we have been displaced to the building next door (Hatcher Graduate Library), in the **Hatcher Gallery Computer Lab** on the first floor. Hatcher has shorter hours than Shapiro; Hatcher opens at 8 on weekdays and at

10 on Saturday, closes at midnight most days but at 7 pm on Fridays; Shapiro is open "24/7" -- these hours should allow us to meet during normal Council hours, i.e. 9am to 5 or 6 pm on each of our meeting days.

Space for break-out sessions has not been secured. We should be able to scrounge public space, especially in Shapiro. There is less public space in Hatcher, but there is some available in the stacks, e.g. 3rd floor north stacks, or floor BA (?) towards the southwest along the windows. Explore. Don't get lost.

Wireless access

UM supports eduroam, which is probably the best option for most Council members. The MGuest network is available to everyone else. If necessary, we should be able to obtain temporary visitor logins to the MWireless network, but I am told that this provides no real advantages over MGuest (same speed, etc.), unless you need to access resources permitted only to UM students, faculty, and staff.

The hotel offers wi-fi without any extra charge.

Getting to Ann Arbor (from DTW)

AirRide. The cheapest and most convenient, if it happens to coincide with your arrival time, is probably the "AirRide" bus service run by the Ann Arbor Transit Authority (AATA), http://www.myairride.com/ This costs \$12 each way when pre-booked; \$15 (exact amount required) when not. Unfortunately, this bus no longer stops at the Central Campus bus stop (right down the street from the hotel), but only at Briarwood Mall (three miles south of the hotel) or at the Blake Transit Center (less than half a mile to the west). The latter is obviously the better choice. It is about ten minutes on foot from the hotel. See this Google map:

If you do choose to use this bus, and to pre-book, be sure to print out everything and bring it with you, since the paperwork will serve as a ticket to be presented to the driver.
