### **Observations**

- About 15% of survey respondents were female. This number roughly corresponds to our Scholarship applications, where about 12% of those who applied were women.
  - Note About 23% of selected scholarships were women, so this number is expected to be less skewed in the actual conference
- Almost all the respondents (93%) can communicate in English.
  - o Of the remaining 5 of them speak Hindi or Urdu, 2 speak Tamil and one is Odia.
  - o Community members can act as volunteers for the remaining editors.
  - Hindi is understood by about 36% of Survey applicants. So, for those editors with difficulty in communication, can also be a language of choice.
- Most respondents are already involved in improving Wikimedia projects (75%).
- The respondents are, on average, extremely involved with Wikimedia projects. 66% of respondents have been editing for at least a year, with 25% being involved for over five years.
  - A good number of sessions can be focused on experienced community members (as opposed to beginner level workshops)
- At least 28% of the applicants are definitely attending WCI 2016 and about 59% more will attend if they get a scholarship. This could be attributed to the difficulty of travelling across the subcontinent.
  - A good number of these respondents are already getting Scholarships.
  - A greater percentage of the Conference funds could be alloted for Scholarships if not many of the respondents get to attend the Conference.
- A large number of respondents are active on the English projects (75%) with the rest scattered across various language Wikis.
  - More sessions could be conducted pertaining to the English language Wikipedia and other projects
- 90% of respondents are involved with Wikipedia and about 50% on Wikimedia Commons. The rest are scattered across multiple projects.
  - A large number of sessions can be focused on the various Wikipedias and how to improve them.
- Over 70% of respondents want to either upgrade their skills, learn about Wikimedia movement in India or meet other Wikimedians. Over 50% want to solve issues together or present their own ideas.
- An overwhelming majority (76%) were interested in Wikimedia in Education, with over 50% interested in community collaborations, socialising and meetups. The rest were scattered across sessions.
  - A greater importance can be given to sessions about collaboration with Educational Institutions. Sessions on Wikimedia movement, workshops and meetups could also be given priority.

- A large number of respondents were interested in presentations by other Wikimedians and workshops (74% and 67% respectively). Over 50% of them showed interest in Panel discussions, Editathons and Q&A sessions.
  - A dedicated sessions track could be there for workshops and presentations during the sessions. The other tracks could have a combination of the other session formats.
- About 81% of respondents wanted to learn about Wikimedia tools and gadgets while 63% were interested in Translation and writing. Over 50% were interested in Wikidata and WMF Programs.
  - Wikidata and WMF Programs can have at least one or two dedicated sessions.
  - Workshops on Wikimedia tools and translation could take higher precedence for sessions.

### Learnings

Through the survey, the Programs team learned vital information for WikiConference India 2016, in terms of the expected audience as well as the type of sessions to be focused on.

There is significant Gender Gap among Wikimedians in the respondents. While Scholarships have been one way to counter it, having more discussions and measures to reduce it further are required.

Some of the topics are deemed more important by the community. So, apart from the standard call for proposals, the Programs team shall be trying to invite speakers experienced in the respective fields to host and conduct sessions on the topics.

A good number of respondents also focused on the importance of meeting other Wikimedians. Being the first WikiConference India in about half a decade, having the community familiarise themselves with each other and collaborating on issues is very relevant. The Programs team shall try to increase the duration for Meetups and other Social events during the conference.

Note - Even though most of the respondents are experienced Wikimedians, the Team also expects significant non-Wikimedian participation from local schools and colleges. Hence there will be workshops and sessions focused at them as well.
