Committee report summary:

- Well, we had a major election
- Our top-line campaigns lost, and our rent board slate, 3 ballot props & 1 Richmond City councillor won
- Jovanka has reached the # of votes we'd have needed to win if turnout was slightly higher than 2014, and Alameda County became one of the few places Prop 10 passed 50%. We had ~150 members volunteer over the course of the campaigns, and ~250 non-DSA members sign in at our campaign events.

Major projects update:

- We've held 2 leadership team debriefs: one the day after the election to plan for immediate next-steps, and a more complete retrospective
- We're planning a full debrief for all members and non-member volunteers interested in electoral work for Saturday Dec 8. Original time was cancelled because of smoke.
