

She occasionally teaches in public and private schools as a long-term substitute music teacher and continues to maintain a private studio.

Kapitaniuk received her Bachelors of Music in Music Education at the Wheaton College Conservatory of Music (IL) in 2017, studying clarinet with Trevor O'Riordan, conducting with Dr. Daniel Sommerville and Dr. John W. Trotter, and music education with Dr. Timothy Yontz. She student taught with Victor Anderson in the Yorkville High School music department and with Allison Rider at Fischer Middle School. Bryan Polacek is an active performer and educator. As an orchestral player, he has performed with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, Evanston Symphony Orchestra and Fundacion Sinfonia in the Dominican Republic. He was a Gold Medalist at the Fischoff National Chamber Music Competition. His ensemble, Bicinia, received a year-long Chamber Music America Rural residency grant in Selma, Alabama. Chuck Parrish began playing trumpet in 1975 and has earned his living as a performer and private teacher for over 35 years. In that time he has performed almost every style of music; from classical to circus, big band to Broadway, and soul to rock and roll. As a teacher he works with students ranging from beginners to professionals. Efficient use of air, smart practice, and passionate performance are vital traits he tries to ingrain in his students. Some of the more notable artists he has performed with are Ray Charles, Stevie Wonder, Jazz at Lincoln Center with Wynton Marsalis, The Chicago Sinfonietta, Jersey Boys, West Side Story, and Aretha Franklin. He teaches at various Chicago area schools and colleges and performs at some of Chicago's best jazz venues including Andy's Jazz Club, the Jazz Showcase, and the Green Mill.

Lukasz is a sought after clinician/guest artist. Big Bad Bones is under the artistic direction of Luis Bonilla (Vanguard Jazz Orchestra) and tours throughout the United States and Europe.
