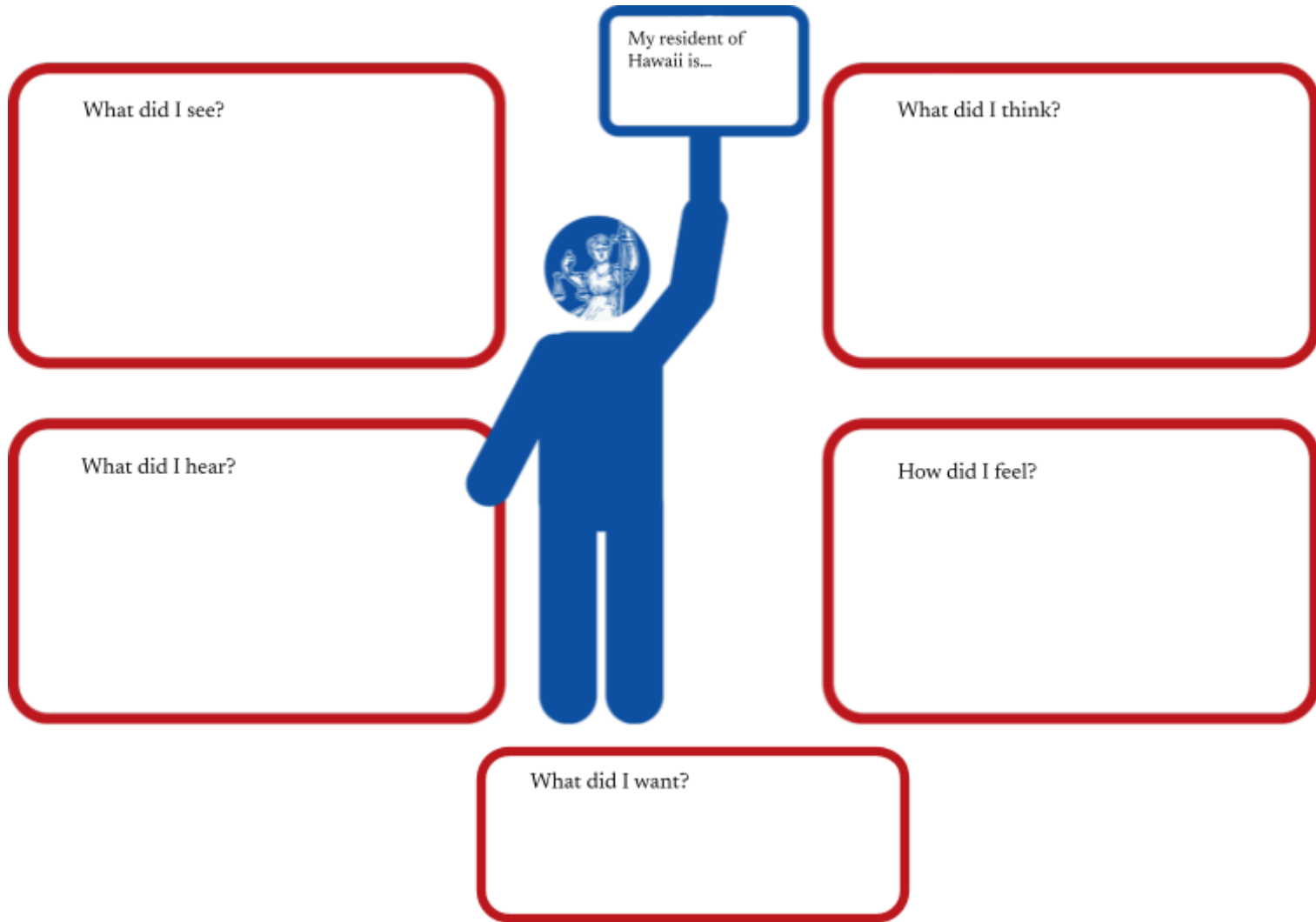


Sensory Figure for a Resident of Hawai‘i at the Time of Annexation
