Greg McBain

Class of 2000

Greg had one of the most successful careers in Warrior boys' basketball history. A four-year member of the varsity. Greg's teams amassed a 73-29 overall record (0.715) and 37-7 (0.841) in the BPSL culminating with back-to-back undefeated division seasons and three league titles. Greg was awarded All-BPSL First Team 1998-99, 1999-2000, three time All-Suburban, and First Team All-Bergen County 1999-2000. The team won back-to-back NJSIAA Sectional crowns during Greg's junior and senior years, the only time in program history. Greg finished his career with 1003 points, 808 rebounds, 182 blocks and 186 assists.

In his last season, Greg was a MacDonal's All-American Honorable Mention and first team Group 1 All-State. He had 20 'double-doubles' and was selected to play in both the North-South All-Star and Bergen-Passaic All-Star games. Greg was recruited by several Division 1 colleges including Loyola, Maryland. Greg spent two years at Fairleigh Dickinson before transferring to Ramapo College.

While at Ramapo, the 2002-2003 men's basketball team saw one of the most successful seasons in the history of the program. The team finished the year at the NCAA "Elite Eight" after breaking many Ramapo records along the way. The Roadrunners finished the season standing 26-4 overall, 17-1 NJAC. Ramapo broke the all-time school record for wins (24) set by the 1991 "Final Four" team while also breaking the all-time school record for win streak (11) set by the same team. During Greg's tenure at Ramapo, the team posted 17 straight wins and recorded the best conference and overall records in the school's history. The Roadrunners were the first to ever clinch 1st place in the conference for basketball. They surpassed the 1st and 2nd rounds of the NCAA Tournament. Greg and his teammates were inducted into the Ramapo Athletic Hall of Fame in 2012.

Greg has spent the last several years as the Lady Warriors varsity basketball coach and will move over to lead the boys' varsity team beginning next year.
