Events & Policies

Junior Prom

Themes & The Boat

Throughout our planning process, we'll release comprehensive JProm input forms including possible options for themes and our JProm boat.

~ Theme Ideas:

- **Under The Stars:** midnight blue backdrops with silver and gold decorations, fairy lights, hanging stars & moons
- **Golden Hour:** gold, amber, sunset red, pale peach color decorations, warm lighting on tables
- **Enchanted Forest:** deep green, moss, soft ivory, warm gold, hints of light brown, fairy lights, hanging realistic greenery decorations
- **Under The Sea:** deep ocean blue, teal, sand colors, royal blue table decor
- Juniors can also suggest their own theme ideas with our form!

~The Boat:

- An input form will be sent out in December for juniors to vote on the boat they'd like for prom!
- **Hornblower Infinity**: a four deck, 1000 person capacity yacht that includes an exterior sky deck and five dance floors. Used for this year's JProm. Total prom ticket costs will likely be higher with the Hornblower Infinity.
- **Spirit of New York**: a four deck, 600 person capacity yacht that includes an exterior sky deck and a large dance floor. Used for last year's JProm. Total prom ticket costs will likely be lower with the Spirit of New York.

Affordability & Tickets

We know that dresses and suits are not cheap for events like JProm. **This is why we plan to accumulate lists of affordable options for outfits for JProm.** This includes dresses/suits giveaways and sales, and generally affordable boutiques. Additionally, we plan to have our Outreach team **work with local businesses to secure exclusive deals and discounts for Stuy Juniors**, including partnerships with hair and nail salons, with

the possibility of extending these benefits to seniors as well. We have already secured a ten percent discount with a local nail salon— this success will only expand with Elly and Olivia as your Junior caucus presidents.

In order to maximize promotion and advertisement for JProm, **we aim to release tickets in Mid-April and offer a \$5 early bird discount.** By incentivizing and allowing more time for juniors to purchase tickets earlier, we hope to encourage greater junior participation and attendance at JProm.

\$5 - \$15 Broadway Trips - Again!

Our two \$15 Broadway Trips this year were a huge success: we were the first caucus to sell out all tickets and make profit. We know how much you all loved the shows, so we want to make the magic happen again next year.

We will partner with the [Theater Development Fund's Access For All](#) program to secure free or low-cost tickets for Juniors— even cheaper than our Broadway Bridges initiative this year. **We've already confirmed our plans with Mr. Polazzo and Ms. Goldpaugh, and are beginning to work towards our TDF partnership right now.** Ms. Goldpaugh, our TDF community member, has already contacted a TDF contact for a possible partnership and is waiting for a reply.

In addition to TDF, we also have other plans. Mr. Hannon, a Junior English teacher, has partnered with Regina Productions to secure \$10 show tickets for his junior students this year. We've met with Mr. Hannon for more information about his partnership, and **we are now in communication with Regina Productions and have already secured a future partnership.** We've connected Mr. Palazzo with Rachel Weinstein and Peter Avery, both of whom coordinate with Broadway shows to offer free to \$10 tickets to students. **We are ready to finalize this partnership right after our election.**

Instead of paying more than \$200 to see Broadway shows, you'll only need to pay \$5 - \$15 with Elly and Olivia as your Junior Caucus presidents. This opportunity allows all juniors the opportunity to continue to experience Broadway at an incredibly affordable price.

Free American Ballet Theater Tickets

We know how much you love theater and affordable, captivating shows. That's why we are expanding theater accessibility to Juniors beyond Broadway shows. We'll be working with the [American Ballet Theater's Student Access Programs](#) to secure free tickets for Juniors. We'll be

experiencing extraordinary performances such as Swan Lake, Don Quixote, The Nutcracker, and more. **Instead of paying up to \$170 to see American Ballet Theater shows, get to attend incredible shows for *free* with Elly and Olivia as your Junior Caucus presidents.**

We've already confirmed the feasibility of this initiative with Mr. Polazzo, and will begin working with Mr. Polazzo and Dr. Yu to apply and enter into ABT's Student Access Programs by the end of next month (June 2026). Because tickets are offered and secured through a first-come, first-served basis, we will track ticket offerings closely throughout the fall and spring performance seasons. Our initiative not only allows Juniors to see ABT shows for free, but also opens up ABT dance and design residency programs to all Stuyvesant students, and cements a close Stuyvesant connection with ABT that can benefit all future grades.

College Tours

On the Common Application, colleges often ask "Why Us?" to their applicants. The best way to write a captivating response is to visit these schools beforehand and understand them. That's why, as part of our college readiness initiative, we're continuing the caucus tradition of hosting college tours for our Juniors. But we have a twist: **instead of just having Stuy alumni serve as our tour guides, our group tours will be led by the colleges' admissions office themselves. We've already reached out to schools like Georgetown and John Hopkins' admissions offices about caucus group tours, and their response has been positive.** Many Ivy League and prestigious colleges offer group tour experiences, and we'll be sure to sign our juniors up for them.

There will be three tours throughout the school year. One in October, one during winter break, and one during spring break. We'll collaborate with the Senior and Sophomore Caucuses for these tours to ensure as many Stuyvesant students take advantage of this opportunity as possible. Possible college tour combinations include Yale x Brown, Cornell x Binghamton, Harvard x Tufts, MIT x Boston University x Northeastern, Georgetown x Johns Hopkins University, Williams x Swarthmore, and more. **We already have extensive experience with organizing college tours from Sophomore Caucus this year.**

Tri-Sports Tournament

Following huge success from our sport tournaments this year, we will be continuing planning them into Junior year! We will reach out to StuySports to collaborate for the tournaments to increase student participation, just like what we did this year. **The Tri-Sports Tournaments are all Co-Ed and will encompass volleyball, basketball, badminton or pickleball.** All tournaments will be held in the 3rd floor gym on separate days. **Regarding permission to use**

the gym, we will consult Mr. Moran and Mr. Bologna. Winners from this year's tournaments received prizes such as coupons from local restaurants (ex: 50% off from Bondi Sushi). We were able to secure a significant amount of coupons from local businesses and restaurants this year and we are confident that we will be able to continue these great prizes and our success next year.

Movie Night

Our movie nights were relatively successful, so we are looking forward to hosting another movie night in November of our Junior year. It will take place in the Junior atrium, and the movie will be screened on Stuy's large, portable TV. We will also provide popcorn, candy, and drinks, just like we did this year. To decide which movie to watch, we'll send out a preference poll with popular 2026 releases, including Project Hail Mary and The Devil Wears Prada 2.

We'll start planning our November Movie Night in October so we can obtain permission and the event space approval from Mr. Polazzo and Mr. Moran, respectively. As previously mentioned, contact and communication with the administration will be no problem due to our extensive and comprehensive experience in Caucus.

Slime Making

Junior year is the most stressful year of high school, which is why we want to help everyone destress. We'd like to replicate our incredibly successful January Slime Making event this year with a similar slime making event in January 2027. **The event will take place in a classroom, and we'll play the runner-up movie from our Movie Night poll while our Juniors make slime and hang out with friends.** We ran out of glue during our event this year, so we'll make sure to have enough white and clear glue for everyone. In addition, we'll provide extra slime making ingredients such as shaving cream, beads and charms, and other mix-ins for the ultimate experience!

Easter Egg Hunt

Partnering with ARISTA for our Easter Egg Hunt this year proved to be a success! With 63 signups and 520 eggs distributed, we were delighted while planning the event and our participants had so much fun finding their eggs. We'd like to replicate this success next year with a continued ARISTA partnership. **Aidan Zeleniy, next year's ARISTA president, has already confirmed our partnership with ARISTA for next year's egg hunt.**

Planning for the Egg Hunt will be very similar to this year's planning. **Before any decisions are made, we'll propose our event plan to Mr. Palazzo in late February.** Instead of hosting the event in May like this year, we'd love to have our egg hunt next year closer to the actual Easter date. Our event date will likely be during Easter week, the week of March 28th. Eggs will be distributed across the third and fourth floors, and one room on the third floor will be our base room. Just like this year, egg costs will be split 50/50 between ARISTA and caucus. We hope turnout for our egg hunt next year will be just as good as this year's.

Tote Bag Painting

In light of the February break and Valentine's Day, we will be hosting a tote bag decorating event in February for Juniors to relax and destress after completing the first semester. All supplies will be provided by Caucus. We already have an excess of fabric paint from this year, and we're ready to save them for next year's event. Participants from our Sophomore Caucus tote bag decorating event found the event highly enjoyable, and we hope to bring this same result next year.

Junior Atrium Bulletin Board

We'd like to put up a bulletin board at the Junior atrium to create a more informative and interactive centralized information center. The board will be used to put up our monthly newsletters, new resources/opportunities, important announcements, as well as upcoming workshops and events notices. We may also allow our juniors to put up pictures of them and their friends throughout the year! This is all in one space and makes it convenient for Juniors to stop by and get a grasp of important information. **Most importantly, we've already obtained permission from Mr. Moran to set up and operate the bulletin board.**

Junior Atrium Decorating

Following success from our sophomore bar decorations, we will continue this tradition with the Junior atrium. Seasonal decorations will be put up for holidays and countdown to breaks. Additionally, photos of the Class of 2028 will also be displayed around the atrium.

Example: On the day before halloween, we'll set up a decorating event where juniors can come to have their pictures taken for and printed on a polaroid for free, and we'll use these pictures to decorate the junior atrium! There will be 20-30 free polaroid pictures used to decorate the atrium during this event. We're looking forward to making the junior atrium more home-like and comfortable.

Resources & Opportunities

As rising juniors, college preparation is becoming increasingly important. **But you don't have to worry about being uninformed or unprepared—we've got you covered.** We are committed to providing **resources and opportunities** that help prepare the Class of 2028 for the future. This includes SAT/PSAT guides, internship and summer program opportunities, college workshops, college application support, and more.

College Readiness Guides

- **SAT and PSAT**

We plan to compile a list of SAT and PSAT exams and practice resources for our Juniors. It will be similar to the [PSAT 10 guide](#) we released this year but significantly more informative, since the Junior year PSAT will be determining scholarship eligibility. We'll make our PSAT guide over the summer so it's ready for immediate release in the fall. Our guides will include any exam studying materials and resources, and even free exam prep opportunities from tutoring centers or organizations.

- **Naviance guide**

While Naviance is available for all students to utilize and access college admissions information, not every student is aware that it is an incredibly helpful resource when it comes to analyzing admission statistics specific to Stuyvesant. While the college office does host a Naviance workshop, not all students attend. Therefore, we plan to create an easy to follow guide for Juniors to get comfortable with using Naviance and start researching potential college choices.

- **Comprehensive Junior Summer Program & Opportunities List**

Our Internals department will work closely with Mr. Blumm to develop an easy to access, easy to read, easy to understand spreadsheet with great and accessible summer opportunities in specific fields. **Mr. Blumm is incredibly eager to work with us to develop this spreadsheet.** The spreadsheet will contain general overviews of each program, their application deadlines, their application requirements, program costs, and application fees & financial aid (if any).

- **Summer opportunities & College applications organizer**

The summer of Junior year is a critical time for college application preparation and summer program opportunities. To help juniors get a head start with this, we will create spreadsheet templates for students to track their summer programs and college

applications, including lab outreach trackers such as [this one](#).

- **Stuy Colleges (aggregate) List**

In addition to our summer opportunities and college applications organizer, we also plan to create a spreadsheet condensing all important Stuy Naviance college admissions information. The spreadsheet will include information about Stuy-specific admissions statistics, application fees, deadlines, and more. Juniors will be able to easily access these info and get a head start with thinking about potential schools to apply to. ([Reference](#))

College Readiness Workshops

In addition to our college tours, we'll also provide frequent college readiness workshops to Juniors throughout the year. Our two online college readiness workshops this year were incredibly successful, with attendance peaking at over 100+ participants. We'd like to hold similar and even better workshops next year.

- **Alumni Discussion Workshops**

We'll invite recent Stuy graduates to talk about their personal experiences with the college application process and their own unique college experiences. We'll try our best to schedule these in conjunction with their college breaks so our speakers are in NYC and are able to come in for in-person workshops. These workshops will be held before each of our college tours, and speakers will be students from the colleges we'll visit. In these workshops, recent graduates will share how their Stuy experience prepared them for college apps, their own advice on getting a head start, their experience in their first year of college, and even share some of their essays and short responses from their application. There will be three Alumni Discussion Workshops, just like there are three college tours. **Mr. Blumm has informed us that he's willing to find us Alumni speakers for these workshops.**

- **College Preparation Workshops**

Similar to our college workshops this year, we'll reach out to college readiness nonprofits and organizations to hold online workshops for our Juniors. This year we partnered with Y Tu Tambien (YTT) and H&C College Consulting for our workshops. **We will continue our partnership with these organizations and create new partnerships with other NYC organizations through outreach.** These organizations include College Access: Research and Action (CARA), College Access Consortium of New York (CACNY), and more. There will be at least two of these in the year: one in October for Junior year advice, and one in May for application readiness.

- **Summer Opportunity Workshop With Mr. Blumm**

Many of us don't take advantage of many of the summer opportunities available to us. This year, many sophomores found themselves scrambling in April or May for summer programs and opportunities, which isn't ideal. To prevent this next year, we are collaborating with Mr. Blumm for an online Summer Opportunity Workshop in January 2027, open to all juniors and parents. During our workshop, Mr. Blumm will present his highlights for junior-specific STEM, Humanities, Arts, Service, and other summer opportunities. He'll also lay out his tips for managing so many applications, advise juniors on what to do next, and take questions from our Q&A. **We've already met with Mr. Blumm, and he was eager to finalize our partnership for this workshop for January 2027, when summer programs applications usually peak.**

Speaker Events

Besides college workshops, we also plan to host speaker events with professionals from different fields. Juniors will be able to hear about experiences and advice they normally wouldn't get in a classroom. Students will hear directly from professionals and alumni about real experiences. **Mr. Blumm has confirmed that he is able to find us alumni speakers for our industry panel speaker events.** After success from this year's workshops/speaker events, we would like to expand the background of our speakers by inviting professionals from a wide range of fields, including lawyers, doctors, and Principal Investigators (PIs) from research labs, to give students insight into different career paths and opportunities. **We also hope to invite Nzingha Prescod and Krystal Lara, accomplished Stuyvesant alumni Olympic athletes, to speak about their experiences balancing academics and athletics at a high level.** In the past, Sophomore Caucus '22-'23 successfully invited Olympian gold medalist Vincent Zhou, showing that events like these are both possible and highly engaging for students.

Monthly Magazine: The Junior Journal (The Jrnl.)

After two years of success with our Caucus newsletters, we will continue the creation and publication of our monthly magazine— this time called The Junior Journal or *The Jrnl.*. To better suit the academic and extracurricular goals of our Juniors, we strive to make our Junior newsletter more informative. We will include the usual monthly events, club highlights, caucus progress, caucus's pick of summer program/opportunities, member of the month. In addition, we will add new features such as Junior spotlights and college features every month.

Monthly Emails

There's a lot happening in Junior year, so we want to keep everyone informed! Our monthly emails will contain updates on Junior Caucus operations, our planned events for the month, and

what Juniors can expect for the next month. We'll also include a PDF copy of The Jrnl. and highlights of other events happening in the school. We want to continue our value of transparency next year, so check your email inbox regularly!

Fundraisers

After our two extremely successful bake sales and other fundraising events, we've learned exactly how caucus fundraising works. This includes communicating with administration, organizing goods to sell, and especially all the paperwork involved. **We were able to raise over \$2,000 this year, which was the most out of any caucus this year.**

Bake Sales

Sophomore Caucus held two incredibly successful bake sales this year, with the profits from both of them combined nearly reaching \$1,300. We used these funds to cover our more expensive events of the year, such as snow globe making and tote bag painting, as well as our end-of-year Sophomore Festival on June 1st.

We will apply our extensive knowledge of Caucus financing and bake sale planning to fundraise as much as we can for our JProm. While some funds will go to our smaller events throughout the year, our main focus is to lower JProm prices as much as possible.

- **Open House Bake Sales**

During the double-day October open house and the single-day March open house, we'll sell various baked goods, snacks, and drinks to prospective Stuyvesant students. We expect the three bake sales to generate a combined profit of more than \$1,500. **In terms of planning, we will meet with Ms. Ingram to propose our plans more than a month before our bake sales, coordinate member volunteers, and buy/bake our goods a few days in advance.**

- **Double Day School Bake Sale**

Similar to how the 2024-2025 Junior Caucus held a double day bake sale, we'll also hold a double day bake sale to fundraise for JProm in December. This bake sale will not only include baked goods but also warm, comforting drinks such as hot chocolate, apple cider, and tea. Per usual when executing caucus initiatives, we'll meet with Ms. Ingram and the administration at least one month before our bake sale to propose our plans. The bake sale will likely be in front of the Senior Bar. We expect to generate approximately \$1,300 from the bake sale, all of which will go towards funding JProm.

Polaroid Fundraiser

During spirit weeks or special occasions where students dress up, Junior Caucus will set up a polaroid photo station in the atrium. Caucus members will take polaroid pictures for Juniors and each polaroid will be sold at the following prices:

- \$2 per polaroid picture, \$3 for 4
- \$1 for putting it up on the atrium wall for a month, taking it home after the month is up

We will carry out the polaroid fundraiser two times in Junior year, one in first semester and another one in second semester.

Sponsorships

The 2023-2024 Junior Caucus team was able to accumulate ~\$12,000 dollars in funds for events and JProm, with a large majority of that number coming from donors. We have reached out to the same donors and they are willing to support our JProm again next year through substantial donations. This is a huge step towards our goal of lowering JProm prices next year.
