

- I - The site of the attack, in Palmetto. On Wednesday, February 24th, 2021, the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant was attacked by the forces aboard King Leer's craft, and collapsed and sunk into the Manatee River. As investigation continued, fatality estimates rose, from an initial estimate in the fifties to a current estimate of 72,

including 12 Practitioners and 60 Innocents; this count has not moved since Tuesday, March 2, 2021. Many friendly Others also perished in the attack, and their numbers are harder to measure.

- II - Home of Brian Bader (also known as Occult Magic Online user FishieFish99), a Palmetto-based Host of fish spirits, the Practitioner who called on King Leer to attack the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant and its inhabitants. Bader is an associate/victim of the Pescator, a predatory Other who Awakens Practitioners like Bader, planning to consume them when they have become sufficiently inhuman. Bader was apprehended on Saturday, February 27, 2021, and exiled from the state of Florida and surrounding waters on Saturday, March 6, 2021. Many vengeful Practitioners and Others would still like to see him dead.
- III - The Barneby numerologist family, based out of Foxleigh. An extremely private and reclusive family; they number all of their members, but seem to skip numbers divisible by three. They have spearheaded efforts to track down Bader and the Pescator.
- IV - Home of the late Jasper Gualtieri, the primary target of the attack and its first casualty; he was killed instantly by a long cable that King Leer threw around his neck. Jasper Gualtieri had been another prospective victim of the Pescator, but realized he was being preyed upon and severed contact. Unfortunately, Bader apparently punished him for this "betrayal" by calling out a hit on him, which had substantial additional collateral damage.
- V - The Willoughby shaman family, based out of Longboat Key. An up-and-coming family focused on household pests' spirits. Their heir was one of those lost in the attack. A Heath had recently married into their family (the Willoughby heir's wife, also one of those killed), and it is presumed that this is the reason for the Heaths' speedy response to the crisis.
- VI - The Heath necromancer family, based out of Safety Harbor. An extensive, ambitious, and centuries-old group, with presence throughout much of the South. The leadership of the family just moved to Florida from Missouri a few decades ago - a move they would quickly come to regret, when a widely-recognized diabolist cabal began buying property near them. In addition to the Heath who died alongside her husband (the Willoughby heir), two other Heaths died, after they were called in to help fend off the attack. The Heaths have shown few outward signs of grief, as is typical of their unusual relationship with death. Heaths don't really lose their family members; they just move on to the next life stage (death).
- VII - The Roff summoner family, based out of South Brandenton. A family focused on defensive Practice, they expected to be a great help in fending off the attack, but they instead suffered devastating losses. Two or three mothers from the Roff family were killed (see XII), and one of these murders orphaned three children. The Roff family seems to have focused their attention on the extermination of goblins.
- VIII - Home of the late Carol Rhodes, another victim of the Pescator. Like Gualtieri, Rhodes came to understand that she was being lured to an untimely end. On March 20, 2020, Bader personally had Rhodes killed on the Pescator's behalf. Unlike the attack Bader directed on the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant using the internet, this murder did not involve any collateral damage.
- IX - The Monadic Circle, based out of Sarasota; an old but non-hereditary Practitioner group with ties to academia. Also numerologists, but with hints of the divine in their Practice, the Monadic Circle are an influential but quiet force known to do business

with the Barnebys. Three of their number were visiting the restaurant (presumably meeting with Gualtieri) and were killed in the early stages of the attack; it is likely that the remaining members of the Monadic Circle have directed the Barnebys to take action.

- X - Queen Syme's Siren Nation, one of the most powerful Other groups in the region (since Queen Syme's arrival off the coast of Florida around 1900). Three lesser Sirens were killed in the attack, but this was only a portion of the offense to Queen Syme - she is enraged because of the threat to local tourism. Tourism is one of the major local industries the Sirens most care about (others include fashion and sex work). Queen Syme is a prime candidate for unseating and replacing the Lord of Tampa Bay, and she might be the loudest voice calling for consequences here. I have already noted this elsewhere on the forum, but Sirens deal in glamour, much as faerie do. I receive a regular supply of glamour from Queen Syme. Our trade relationship was nearly ruined - which I can assure you would have left me much worse than upset - when she found out that I use OMO. I had to meet with her in person to persuade her that this was a reasonable activity on my part, and I can still scarcely believe that I successfully made my case.
- XI - Home of the late Morgan Mead, a middle-aged dabbler from Parrish. Morgan rushed to the crisis as soon as she heard, and was killed. She is survived by her non-Practicing family, including her husband and two adult children.
- XII - Sarasota home of an anonymous Scourge couple and their infant child. The mother, a teenager, showed up to the attack and was killed. Afterwards, the Roffs alleged that she was their runaway daughter. This claim certainly appears to be true (story makes sense, connections check out, appearance is close enough), but remains unproven by some standards, and has proven to be a political apple of discord.
- XIII - Deep Hole, a colossal (200-foot-wide) sinkhole in Myakka River State Park. The prior residence of the Pescator, the Other indirectly responsible for the attack on the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant (as Brian Bader was his thrall and was motivated by his thralldom, and Brian Bader invited King Leer to launch the attack). The Pescator has his roots in Spanish Florida, and has weakened in the modern era as the territory has come under the control of a different empire. He did apparently live here for some time, but has fled the country, and can no longer be found.
- XIV - Lake Myakka, home of the mid-tier goblin Bel Lashudder. She has obviously not taken kindly to the Roffs' attempts to kill her or push her out of the region, and she seems to be growing in power. She has assembled local goblins into an army, and she is calling for aid from greater forces. She initially wanted King Leer to come back, but since his death, she's been reaching out to other aligned greater goblins and goblin kings. Several individuals I would very much like to never meet have expressed interest in Bel's cause. (The Pescator also supposedly lived in Myakka River State Park, but he has not been seen there since the incident.)
- XV - The small but recently Practice-heavy town of Edgeville, which contains several relatively powerful families. The Monadic Circle had been setting up defensive wards for Edgeville, but these plans were interrupted. The population of Edgeville has expressed grave interest in ensuring that no perpetrators of the attack go unpunished.
- XVI - Former home of Mortimer Stroud, a Finder from Palmetto. He was present at the attack and fled as soon as he realized what was happening. Local Practitioners and Others decried him as a coward so vehemently that he opted to move to Vermont.

- XVII - Fort Lonesome Abyss Entrance. Once a bustling Practitioner community, this area fell into the Abyss sometime in the mid-twentieth century. As the entire region has been destabilized, more outlying areas of Fort Lonesome have crumbled and fallen into the Abyss. This in particular has gotten worse, not better, with King Leer's death.
- XVIII - The small but long Practice-heavy town of Duette, which is particularly threatened by the Abyssal expansion of Fort Lonesome. There's a UFO cult here, the Schuylers, who say that King Leer's attack on the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant heralds the end of the world. Full disclosure, though, they say a *lot* of things herald the end of the world.
- XIX - Palmetto home of an Innocent man, Jake Stillworth, who witnessed the attack and was left Awestruck. He needed to be put in the custody of the Lord of Tampa Bay, as he was ranting and raving about goblins for days, and posed a severe risk of rendering other Innocents Aware.
- XX - A minor sea serpent had to be put down here, by the Sunshine Skyway Bridge, on Thursday, February 25, 2021. It had apparently been caught and corrupted in the stream of intense ocean pollution emitted by King Leer's craft, and it was threatening to destroy the bridge. Carlos Jardines and the heads of the Heath, Willoughby, and Roff families all participated in slaying it.
- XXI - Domain of the Lord of Tampa Bay, the Trafficker. An ancient spirit of trade, greed, and slavery, the Trafficker was a controlling power in the area before Europeans arrived, and adapted well when they did. When the Lord of Tampa Bay heard that the attack in Palmetto was ongoing, he attempted to organize forces to repel it, but he was as always impeded by his nature - he processes any interaction in terms of how he can profit from it. A portion of the blame for the disaster has been laid at his feet, and he has deflected from this by encouraging retribution against those more directly responsible. He has repeatedly contacted OMO's administrators, and made a series of failed bids to purchase the site. There has long been talk of pushing the Lord of Tampa Bay out. He is not a good Lord, but I'm not sure if the region could survive the resulting chaos.
- XXII - The town of Lakeland. Lakeland's Practitioners and Others have long wanted their own Lord. The case on whether or not they should have one is complicated. They would be a relatively small Lordship for Florida, but they're on the borderline, sizewise; they aren't just one of the many small Lord-less towns. The Lord of Tampa Bay - who currently holds a claim over Lakeland - is dead-set against the notion of a Lord of Lakeland existing, at least not without getting a prohibitive payoff. But Lakeland has little connection to Tampa, and a collective distaste for being controlled by outsiders. Lakeland has made it clear that this is the second strike against the Lord of Tampa Bay, and when the third strike comes, they will take it up with a Judge. If Lakeland won such a challenge, it would also weaken Tampa's hold over many other small towns throughout the area, which could easily default to being Judge-ruled.
- XXIII - The Downtown Clearwater Diabolist Zone. In 1975, Tampa Bay probably suffered the worst misfortune in its history. A new but immensely powerful diabolist cabal, with an army of Innocent human shields, purchased the deteriorating Fort Harrison Hotel in Clearwater, and made it one of their main bases of operations. Since, despite the suppressive efforts of local powers, the cabal has expanded its Clearwater territory many times over, by devaluing and then buying up more and more

property. Clearwater's whole downtown area is as good as lost; no one should ever go there, and diabolists aside, Practitioners and Others generally know this. Clearwater's diabolists have seized advantage of the panic and distraction around them. In the past two weeks, many enemies of the cabal - mostly Innocents - have been threatened or, God forgive us all that we've allowed this, attacked. Every other local power desperately wants the cabal to suffer for this, but resources are spread thinner than they usually are. The cabal can get away with more.

- XXIV - A semi-Aware citizen activist against the cabal was finally convinced to skip town. He was apparently shown some pictures no-one should ever see and given an ultimatum. He was also misled, whether intentionally or unintentionally, into believing that the cabal was responsible for the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant disaster.
- XXV - A shop owner who'd held out for literal decades refusing to sell her property to the cabal checked herself into a psychiatric ward last week. She now hears a dozen squabbling voices in her head, trying to pull her in a dozen different directions. There are many other powers trying to prevent the cabal from acquiring that property, but their main obstacle is now out of the way. My understanding is that that woman will never stop hearing those voices.
- XXVI - An Innocent pastor, close to the Heaths, responsible for covert political organizing against the cabal, supposedly died in late February, at an old age, from grief over the disaster or something like that. The body is a forgery; he was abducted. Given the lengths the cabal went to to fake his death, though, this isn't a ransom scheme. The Heaths have told me that they would know if he was actually dead; they are necromancers, after all. They wish he was actually dead. We all do. These are far from the only three recent attacks of opportunity the cabal has made on Innocents. We doubt we've even tracked all of those down, and if I included every relevant incident I knew about on this map, the dots would all bleed together into a sea of red.
- XXVII - Home of the powerful and admired Largo Goblin King, Carlos Jardines. Revered in Largo for slaying the Tyrant Chronomancer who'd kept its people oppressed and impoverished for generations, Jardines is widely seen as a heroic figure who Practices to protect the Innocent. I have met and dealt with Carlos Jardines myself, and I share this impression of him; he is a good man deeply burdened by his sense of responsibility for the world around him. He was away from Florida on business on Wednesday, February 24, 2021, and was unable to respond to the King Leer situation. That fact is terribly unfortunate, as Jardines would have come to defend the restaurant had he been available, and if he had, he would have been an ideal counter to Leer and his cronies. Predictably, this has led some to blame *Jardines* for the attack, for not being there. He has been working overtime since to smooth it over and try to make up for it, and his life was one filled with stress already.
- XXVIII - Home of Anna Morse, recent inheritor of a powerful Genius Loci (a building with a soul, which acts as a sort of conscious, transferable demesne) in St. Petersburg, Florida. I am close to Miss Morse. She is distraught by recent events. This is largely because of direct connection to the attack: she knew several of the victims, both Practitioner and Innocent. But she is also distraught by the aftermath, on many levels. She is perhaps the least mobile Practitioner in the area, and the prospect of Clearwater's diabolists expanding their reach and power weighs on her heavily. Dangerous Others are gathering in the area, and as she is sitting on a place of power, they are gathering towards her. She had casual arrangements in place with Carlos

Jardines - they were growing closer together as allies - and he has been forced to cut those arrangements off, as his workload has been scaled up; he's been putting more time into his more formal relationship with the Heath family. Anna Morse is one of my main Practitioner contacts. She is a source of much of the information in this post.

- XXIX - Clearwater Beach, the primary location where the Girl With The Mustang Shirt is found. This Practitioner - a powerful young Harbinger losing touch with her humanity - is associated with beaches, where she appears at a glance to be an ordinary tourist's child. In fact, she has no mortal guardians; she can call on the coastline to move, if it needs moving. On occasion, she's referenced her patron - the god Neptune, perhaps better known as Poseidon. The Girl With The Mustang Shirt has amplified the Sirens' calls for justice in the wake of the attack, and has added in even more serious concerns, regarding the pollution King Leer struck into surrounding waters, and its catastrophic effect on marine life. The Girl With The Mustang Shirt has called on OMO to close. If you've ever met the Girl With The Mustang Shirt, you know you don't want to be on her bad side. She may be ten years old, but her voice belongs to something far older and nastier.
- XXX - Throughout the West Coast of central Florida, cetaceans, manatees, and other marine animals have been beaching and dying in mass. Although Innocent media has sought out a scientific explanation (and typically fails to connect this trend to the disaster in Palmetto), this behavior is clearly driven by the pollution effect King Leer's craft always inflicts where it travels. Few other places King Leer has traveled have seen a similar severity of ecological damage; it seems likely that he deliberately lingered in our waters so as to accomplish this. The deaths have thankfully peaked and started declining, but the rates are still up.
- XXXI - Treasure Island, Florida, home of a wealthy Gilded Lily. Unique, valuable items routinely wash up in her backyard. The blessing is as much tied to the house itself (which has been in her family for generations) as it is to her family line; if she were to sell the property to a stranger, one presumes the pattern would be broken. In the past five weeks, her new acquisitions have taken a distinct turn for the worse - they have become disgusting, dangerous, dead or goblin things. A jewel-encrusted dolphin skull, coated in something oily, carrying a deadly and volatile curse that rubs off on any who touch it. A rusting ball of spikes and gore, which replenishes itself and attracts scavengers that it kills and uses to replenish itself. A locked box containing something malicious, pretending to be a human child and begging to be let out (which is thankfully impossible as there is no associated key). The Gilded has a vague understanding of why this is happening, and has made noise about selling the house and moving if things don't turn around soon. They have not turned around yet, despite her frequent clients' attempts to convince her they will.
- XXXII - Philippe Park in Safety Harbor. Primary "home" location associated with the Smoking Man, a bogeyman seen throughout Tampa Bay. The Smoking Man is believed to be Odet Philippe, a Practitioner, industrial-scale slaveowner, and the first recorded European settler in Tampa Bay. Although the Lord of Tampa Bay does not share the Smoking Man's vicious racism or "Lost Cause of the Confederacy" sentiment, he does employ the Smoking Man as one of his primary attack dogs. As the Lord of Tampa Bay is currently trying to divert attention from himself, the Smoking Man is currently far more active than he should be. The Smoking Man is always surrounded and obscured by a thick cloud of toxic smoke, which is made of spirits that

act as extensions of him; as a Practitioner, Philippe was a shaman with a pipe Implement, and as a bogeyman, he has apparently swallowed and internalized it, making it into a passive, reflexive, and strong part of himself. He also carries a whip, which has replaced his pipe as his main active magical tool. After a brief surge in attacks in Philippe Park, the Heaths kindly stepped up and imposed a ward discouraging Innocents from visiting. This does not, however, prevent the Smoking Man from leaving the park.

- XXXIII - Site of a Smoking Man attack on Wednesday, March 10, 2021, in Town n' Country, Florida. An Innocent group of six workers were approached by the Smoking Man, who they have more-or-less consistently described (without realizing that the supernatural was involved). He threatened and terrorized the group, physically assaulted one man, and left. The group as a whole is expected to deal with breathing problems as a consequence, and two may relapse into past addictions.
- XXXIV - Site of a presumed Smoking Man attack on Wednesday, March 10, 2021, in New Port Richey, Florida. An Innocent man was dragged from a location near his house and beaten beyond recognition. With no leads, police refuse to even treat it as a murder. It is unconscionable that the Smoking Man still walks the Earth, it is unconscionable that the Lord of Tampa Bay would encourage him to rampage as a distraction, and it is unconscionable that our community has been thrown into enough disarray that this can blend into the background for us.
- XXXV - Home of Wilt Dangerfield, a Historical Practitioner in St. Petersburg and an ally of the Heaths. I get the impression that he's in over his head. He's been searching for opportunities to impress the Heaths for a long time, with little success. They're happy to have him on their side, but he doesn't really rate among their assets. He's been looking for a way to make hay out of the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant attack; he's bounced between several different plans to avenge the dead Heaths, even though no one can seem to decide exactly who he should be trying to vanquish, and even though the Heaths themselves don't seem up in arms about the deaths. I think there is some noteworthy chance that he will pursue a (non-noteworthy) attack on OMO, as it is one of the entities that has been blamed.
- XXXVI - The Bien-Aime, Philogene, and Demosthene families are all headed close together, in a single Tampa neighborhood. Together, they form Tampa Bay's "Vodou Triumvirate", a power bloc that deals with Practice derived from diasporic African knowledge and tradition. Although these three families have connections to more powerful groups in Miami, New York, and especially Haiti, they are themselves very powerful in Central Florida. Many newer families ("newer" being a relative term here) look up to them and seek their favor. To my knowledge, the Vodou Triumvirate are no friends of the Lord Of Tampa Bay; they have always stood apart from him, and seem to exist in a strained tension with him. However, they have never sought his removal so far as I know, and the attack on the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant has not changed this. The Bien-Aime and Demosthene heads have both explicitly cited OMO (and the rapid development of the internet more broadly) as the primary cause of the recent disturbances. This is tempered somewhat by the Philogene head, who calls it a distraction from more local problems. However, there is still a high chance that the Bien-Aimes will advance a measure at an upcoming council meeting, to harshly restrict internet use as it relates to the Practice. Even a more moderate "compromise" version

of such a measure would likely ban use of OMO specifically, and I would put high odds on something of the sort passing if put up to a vote.


- XXXVII - Home of Omar Greene-Morris, one of many Tampa acolytes of the Vodou Triumvirate. On Monday, March 8, 2021, Greene-Morris asked his patron families (the Bien-Aimes and Philogenes; he isn't so closely connected to the Demosthenes) if someone should "do something about" OMO. This prompted the statement from the Philogene head that local issues are more important. Although Greene-Morris left the specifics of the "something" to be done up in the air, he dabbles in technomancy, and was likely referring to some form of direct magical attack on OMO's servers. One lone novice Practitioner such as Greene-Morris is no threat to our administrators, but we do not want to see an avalanche of them.
- XXXVIII - Home of the Rene family of Ruskin, an offshoot of the Demosthene family that maintains ties to them. On Friday, March 12, 2021, the Renes formally announced that every member of their family from then on would swear not to voluntarily communicate about the Practice by electronic means with any person they had not already met offline. The spirits acknowledged this pattern, and they granted the Renes power for it. The Renes will continue to earn dividends from this pattern in the future - although they hope to spread it to other families and make it a common Practitioner norm, sacrificing their newfound personal power to improve the wider Practitioner community.
- XXXIX - Home of the McAbee Augur of Tampa. A very private family of Practitioners that, per tradition, maintain a very private life, keeping only shallow connections to other Practitioners at most. Only one member of the family Practices at a time, always a man; only the leading heir is even made Aware. The McAbee Augur made a rare statement following the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant attack: he was the first to outline for our local community what the immediate causes of the attack had been, and consequently he was the first to point the finger at OMO. People would have figured out what happened otherwise; King Leer had deliberately left behind enough evidence. However, the McAbee Augur sped that process along, and guided the direction of discussion. Some have suggested that, with all the power he has, the McAbee Augur should have predicted the attack in advance. In fact, the McAbee Augur's preternatural predictive Practice pertains primarily to his own personal and familial survival.
- XL - In addition to Queen Syme's personal response to the attack, her nation has been thrown into disarray. Her nation includes a wide diversity of aquatic Others and animals, but most importantly, Queen Syme's own race, the Sirens, have been devastated. Sirens are beings born of loneliness, attraction, and frustration. They can attain some peace in the company of other Sirens, but this peace is fragile, as what they truly desire is human companionship. It is remarkable that Queen Syme is strong enough of a leader with strong enough of a will to pull together a large and powerful nation of Sirens that's stable in the long term at all. The death of three Sirens in the attack has sent shock waves through their community, and although Queen Syme's leadership might be the best I've ever witnessed, it is being spread very thin here. Throughout the West Coast of Florida, Sirens are breaking from the established order and violating longstanding treaties by pursuing doomed Familiar relationships with Practitioners. These transgressions are not unprecedented, but their volume in this timespan is.

- XLI - The Millard family of oil elementalists live here, in Bayonet Point. On Sunday, February 28, 2021, the Millards' young son - a *very* young Practitioner - was approached by a Siren in the family's backyard. The Siren, Roxana, took the form of a young girl, apparently composited together from the appearances of several of the boy's friends. She charmed him and offered to become his Familiar before his parents noticed what was going on; the patriarch Millard fired several shots from a gun to frighten the Siren into leaving the property. Queen Syme subsequently had Roxana tracked down and bound as a punishment. Of all severe Siren incidents I know to have occurred recently, this is the closest to Tampa Bay.
- XLII - Tampa Bay Toontown, located in the outskirts of Tampa, Florida. Toons are an endangered race of Other associated with artwork and animation; they nearly went extinct at some unknown time in antiquity, but large numbers of them began to be reintroduced into the world in 1832. Toons have a naturally adversarial relationship with faeries, and although toons have the advantage in a direct confrontation (and, indeed, may have originally been created for this purpose, as living anti-faerie weapons), faeries have access to far more resources and far more history, and can work much more subtly. Although some toons live with Illustrators, toon-focused Practitioners, most rely on Toontowns for safety, ghettos that spring up around select urban centers. Faerie seek to destroy Toontowns where they can; the number of Toontowns has been gradually declining since 1966. Accordingly, faerie-driven rumors have been circulating, scapegoating Tampa's toons for the attack in Palmetto, including completely false insinuations that Brian Bader, the Pescator, or both were toons. Thankfully, I haven't found anyone particularly powerful taken in by these rumors - but I have found plenty of lesser Practitioners and Others who gave them some credence.
- XLIII - Home of the Colby family, a Tampa-based group of Toymakers. The Colbys are just one branch of an extended family of Toymakers that form a loose faction spread throughout the United States; more nuclear family groups with a single surname and head cluster in a single city or area. The Colbys' particular gimmick incorporates elements of Collection into their Practice; each Colby selects a line of mass-market collectibles to draw power from. Practitioner consensus does not include the Colbys among Tampa Bay's great powers, but the Colbys certainly see themselves that way. They're a surprisingly ambitious group, and in the wake of this attack, they've been acting on that ambition, trying to insinuate themselves into community leadership roles where they can. They're trying to establish ties and strengthen and use the ties they already have. Really, relatively speaking, the Colbys are one of the more benign forces in the region - but I think they overestimate themselves and that miscalculation is liable to further destabilize things.
- XLIV - The Colbys have arranged the rental of a large number of hotel rooms in Ybor City, a tourist-oriented neighborhood in Tampa. These rooms are being used to house many Practitioners from out-of-town - the Colbys' network of extended family and allies. Although this arrangement is unstable - most of these Practitioners' interest in the Tampa situation will wane - for the time being, the Colbys have several times as many Practitioners working for them as they normally do. The exact cast of characters varies from day to day, as people come and go, and this further confuses the local scene, which is already in chaos. The most powerful Colby ally, though, the Grammatamancer, is a familiar face and a stabilizing force; he doesn't live in Tampa Bay, but he travels long distances often, and spent much of his time here already. His

loyalties are split: he has a distant relation to the Colbys by blood, which he respects, but he has also openly sworn critical oaths of loyalty to the Heaths. Many suspect that he intends to marry into the Heath family (or remarry, rather; he is an aged widower). Based on my read of the connections, I personally severely doubt it.

- XLV - One of the Heaths who died in the attack lived and worked here, in Tampa. Willow Heath was a schoolteacher, apparently beloved by her fifth graders at Susan Hill Moseley K-8. Several of her favorite students quietly launched an investigation into the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant disaster, noticing incongruities surrounding her death, and over the course of early-mid March 2021, this led to dozens of Innocents, mostly children, becoming Aware. Apparently this hit a point of no return before the Heaths found out about it, because rather than push back and preserve the Innocents' Innocence, the Heaths opted to indulge their new Awareness, privately introducing them to the preserved soul of their late teacher. The Heaths have an established pattern of making Innocents Aware, and even Awakening them, in large numbers, but their usual charges are of an advanced age, or are even on their deathbeds already. This kind of event, with the Heaths welcoming a large community of young people into their outer circle, is extremely unusual even by their standards.
- XLVI - Zephyrhills, Florida, a Practitioner and Other-heavy town within the control of the Lord of Tampa Bay. Zephyrhills' Practitioners have filed a report noting that, since the attack, several of their faeries have become harder to account for. I believe that these errant faeries have been participating in the Innocent reaction to the attack, trying to intensify it; in particular, I see their involvement in many of the memorial services, monuments, and tributes to the disaster and its victims. This attack has left a scar on our community, and these fae are trying to make it larger, more dramatic. With the exception of a few hotspots like Zephyrhills, the Tampa Bay Area has few fae; toons and Sirens occupy niches with a lot of overlap. I am not pleased to see their roaming here so much more freely.
- XLVII - This point in the outskirts of Myakka City has begun to produce old and dangerous Others, some of which haven't been recorded for generations. It's thought that a Native Practitioner is summoning them, but any details specifically identifying this hypothetical Practitioner remain unknown. They've apparently stayed off the radar for a long time.
- XLVIII - Until Monday, February 22, 2021, when King Leer posted on Occult Magic Online, I lived in a house near this point in Tampa. I had lived there for several months, and I was looking to establish a longer-term home there, but King Leer's post made me feel too unsafe. I have now established appropriate precautions, and I will feel comfortable sharing more of myself in the future, but I really do think I was too open in the past, and I will not be returning to live in my prior residence. My panicked departure from the city immediately prior to the attack, and owing to the same Other, obviously directed much suspicion towards me. I have had so many long conversations with so many powerful people on edge, explaining events to them. I'd only foreseen an attack on me because I'd shared too much information about myself; I did not predict that a separate attack would coincidentally happen nearby because of another user.
- XLIX - An Aware man lived here, in Plant City, Florida, a world-weary man. Once a traveling businessman from Europe, in the early 1990s he was caught in the death throes of Largo's Tyrant Chronomancer, and was sent to a world outside of time for just

a moment. He easily could have died there, but his will to live was strong enough that he held out and survived long enough to return. From his perspective, he spent countless lifetimes hunting and being hunted in a shifting primeval wilderness. Fellow human inhabitants of this realm were so rare that he would go centuries without meeting any, and he'd always eventually slip away from them and lose them again; he spent nearly all of his time outside of time alone. When he returned to the modern world - only a moment after he left - he decided to immigrate to the United States. Despite the advice of his Practitioner contacts, he has devoted the remainder of his life to dubious attempts to make use of what he has learned, as he believes his experiences were divinely inspired. On Wednesday, February 24, 2021, when this world-weary man learned of the tragedy at the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant, he immediately began making plans to move to another property he owns in Kentucky, where he now resides; he declared that Florida was no longer safe. While I don't disagree with his assessment, per se, I can't help but think it's something of a self-fulfilling prophecy - the region is even less safe without his karmic weight here keeping it together.



- L - Last known sighting of the Pescator. On Monday, March 1, 2021, the Pescator was spotted at sea by the Trawlers, a large dabbling group of seafaring Practitioners based throughout the Florida Keys. At the time, they did not realize that he was the Pescator, simply that he was beyond their paygrade. Cross-referencing their report, the Pescator appears to have been traveling towards Cuba. Others - especially Others with a long and established history linked to a location - usually suffer from international travel, but the Pescator had already been waning in strength over time, and his roots were in Spanish Florida. As Cuba has been a colony of Spain much more recently than Florida has, I would project that the Pescator will translate relatively well there, and may even benefit from the move long-term. In any case, to the best of my knowledge, the Pescator has not been spotted again since, either in Cuba or elsewhere. Even if he were, extradition of Others across international borders can be very difficult.

- LI - Another more severe Siren incident occurred here in Alva in early March, culminating in a teenage Practitioner's death on Friday, March 5, 2021. A Siren named Bellalina came inland along the Caloosahatchee River and called out to Mark Ritter, sixteen-year-old only child of the Ritter spellbinding family. He responded, and over several days they conspired together to perform a Famulus ritual. Immediately after the ritual was completed, Mark Ritter was caught in a current and swept out to sea, where he drowned. His short-lived Familiar attempted to save his life by breathing air into him, but this tragically failed as they were physically separated from one another. Although Bellalina did not intend this outcome, it was a fully predictable result of her race's curse; Sirens are doomed to bring swift and deadly misfortune to any human, and particularly to any man, who offers them companionship. The Ritters are inconsolable, and will always be shaken by this loss; their family will likely not continue to another generation. Queen Syme had Bellalina sentenced to death and executed within a day of the incident.
- LII - This is the final Siren incident I will note on this version of the map, although I will note that I have omitted most such incidents as insufficiently noteworthy. A novice teenage Practitioner lives here in Steinhatchee, Florida. An Astrologer with few resources and no family history in the Practice, Alex Morrison apparently awakened under remarkably difficult circumstances. On Wednesday, March 3, 2021, she was approached by a Siren named Melina, and was persuaded to take her on as a Familiar. As of my posting this, Miss Morrison is still a living human Practitioner, but Queen Syme and numerous other powerful actors are monitoring the situation. According to a diagnostic augur, there is currently a seven in eleven chance that this Familiar relationship ends with Miss Morrison either violently killed by the Siren's curse or converted into a Siren herself. This chance has varied between six in eleven and ten in eleven since the Famulus ritual; the curse was initially the much more significant threat, but it has since been overtaken by the risk of Otherization. Successful Familiar relationships with Sirens are possible, but are the exception, not the rule; attempting such a relationship is extremely inadvisable.
- LIII - Near Sebring, Florida, there's a powerful but reclusive Finder family, the Ataners. Their forebears actually hail from a Path, the Holy Alter Cathedral (sic), and their Practice incorporates some unique, cryptic elements from their Lost family history there, including worship of some foreign god from beyond the Paths. A Heath recently married into the Ataner family. On Sunday, February 28, 2021, in response to the events in Palmetto, they put out this statement, seemingly corroborating the Schuyler's doomsday prophecy (see XVIII):

Lament! Lament! Lament! So much death has occurred, but it is only a taste of what is to come. So much suffering has befallen so many, but it is like the scraps a dog eats under the table next to what is to come. We tear our clothes in mourning for what has happened, but if we kept tearing them for what is to come, we would be left indecent. Lament, lament, lament, for with this raid and this collapse, the world will fall into place, as it was always going to. It will be as the spoiled whisper on Spoilers Run, because they know how this story ends. It will be as John recorded in his Apokalypsis, because he was told what would become of us. It will be as the angels lament it will be, because they can mourn what has passed even as they celebrate what comes after: it will be the end of this world.

Lament! Our great American nation will rise to new heights, and then it will collapse completely - as the restaurant in the river has demonstrated and preceded! Lament! People across the world will go so hungry that they will eat whatever vermin falls dead in front of them, as the restaurant was felled by the vermin of the Earth! Lament! Lifelong friends everywhere will become like strangers to each other; they'll fade from existence in their loneliness, drowning in themselves, and all because of the death and suffering at that restaurant that drowned.

Lament and repent the extent that we've bent the intent we were sent and were meant to present.

The Ataners are generally considered a more credible source than the Schuylers.

- LIV - Rotonda West, a planned Practitioner community. The entire neighborhood is a colossal diagram, and it gives its Practicing residents a host of benefits (including stores of magical power, a persistent boost to karma, and a wide array of powerful defensive wards) in exchange for an onerous-but-worthwhile set of oaths to respect the council's decisions and regulations, to avoid making conflict among neighbors, and so on. It has a high density of Practitioners, and the waitlist for new arrivals is long. One of the three members of the Monadic Circle who died (see IX) lived in Rotonda West. This connection was valuable for the entire Monadic Circle, and if they'd been able, they would have preferred for the entire group to live in Rotonda West, not just the one member. Following the loss, the Monadic Circle attempted to argue that one of their other members should inherit the residence in Rotonda West. Several of their allies, including the Barnebys, the Willoughbys, and the Heaths, backed them up on this. Rotonda West's council voted the request down, and gave the vacated slot to a family on their waitlist. There has been a *lot* of arguing back and forth on this.
- LV - Domain of the Lord of the Cape. This Faerie Practitioner is one of Florida's more tenuous Lords, but he's still ambitious. His influence doesn't extend nearly as far as the Lord of Tampa Bay; his territory is essentially limited to the Cape Coral/Fort Myers metroplex. However, he's looking to change that: in the wake of the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant disaster, the Lord of the Cape put out a statement, expressing his condolences but also inviting anyone dissatisfied with the Trafficker's Lordship to move closer to the Cape. I have not heard of any humans or noteworthy Others taking him up on it; some goblins have moved south into the Cape, but probably not based on his offer. In the wake of the death of Mark Ritter (see LI), the Lord of the Cape put out another statement, expressing outrage that a Siren, nominally under the Lord of Tampa Bay's authority, had killed one of his citizens. As far as I am aware, the Lord of the Cape's territory had never before that point been taken to extend nearly so far east as Alva. However, I have not heard anyone from the potentially-affected area voice any objections to this apparent new territorial claim.
- LVI - A small-time Goblin King, Vince Madsen, used to live here in Bonita Springs; he owned a pawn shop and kept a demesne there. He was killed age 54 on Tuesday, March 23, 2021, at his place of work after closing hours. As of my writing this, it is not known who or what is responsible, but it is theorized to be a revenge killing, part of the general grassroots campaign among Practitioners to exterminate Florida's goblins in the wake of the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant attack. Madsen was not a well-liked figure, and he had picked up quite a bit of bad karma over his life, but he was a known and explicit ally of goblinkind - including goblinkind's worst aspects. His death was

made to look like a suicide to Innocent investigators, and this matches the modus operandi of several bogeymen who could plausibly have been used as the murder weapon. However, I understand that multiple leading suspects have been investigated and subsequently cleared, so it's likely that something has been missed. Madsen was the last heir of a family of Goblin Kings that has been in decline for generations. He's survived by his father, who has aged out of the Practice, and three younger sisters, who are ineligible to carry on the family line.

- LVII - Avon Park Air Force Range, a military installation. On the night of Wednesday, February 24, 2021, and in the early morning of Thursday, February 25, 2021, a militarized force of several dozen goblins, following instructions from King Leer, launched a series of attacks centered on this bombing range. This force included several moderate goblins that King Leer released during the attack in Palmetto, but the attacks seem to have been otherwise unrelated - the Avon Park attack was specifically targeted at Chloe Savas (OMO user grekhaus), who had contacted King Leer on the forum, hoping to lure him into a carpet-bombing. Savas fended off the attack and survived, and thanks to her heroic efforts (as well as those of local Practitioners, put on high alert by the Palmetto attack), minimal collateral damage was recorded (IE, no human deaths). However, word of the incident has spread, both through Florida and through military-adjacent Practitioners and Others. It has been used in some circles to further a narrative that goblins are enemies of the United States, and to support a goblin exterminationist agenda.
- LVIII - Vorlok of the Traveling Swamp, a greater goblin like King Leer, has been spotted around this area, in the Everglades, with increasing frequency over the month of March. Last spotted previously, to my knowledge, several months ago in Northern Africa, Vorlok possesses an innate ability to teleport around the world, albeit very slowly - the increasingly frequent sightings have occurred because Vorlok and their Traveling Swamp *are increasingly present*. Unlike King Leer, Vorlok is not a particularly social goblin; Vorlok mostly relies on their own raw power, not on a loyal army of connections. However, I believe that Vorlok has come to Florida to answer Bel Lashudder's distress call (see XIV); consequently, when they've finished materializing in the Everglades, I expect them to begin walking north, towards more inhabited areas. A war between Vorlok and goblin exterminationists would be disastrous; frankly, I think Vorlok fighting alone could easily wipe out most of Florida's Practitioners working together. A campaign of revenge against Florida's Practitioners for their crimes against goblinkind would be even worse, and it's a plausible outcome if the goblin exterminationists continue down their current path, hurrying along their killings in hopes of finishing before Vorlok has arrived. Frankly, I don't expect Vorlok to be the only greater goblin to show up here over this, either. Goblin exterminationists in Florida are, figuratively speaking, writing checks they can't cash.
- LIX - In Harker, Florida (itself a ghost town), there's a "Ghost Ranch", a property that attracts echoes, souls, and various spirits related to death. An estimated two hundred departed persons persist on this estate, including both long-term residents and those weaker echoes who fade not long after their arrival. Nearby Practitioners have long employed capable Aware men to guard this property, to prevent arbitrary passersby from being lured to their death there. This is not an altogether uncommon situation; Aware serving this kind of passive "site guard" role are considered akin to, though lesser than, witch hunters. However, when the current cadre of guards in Harker, all

men in their early twenties, heard about the incident at Palmetto, they were apparently deeply touched and inspired: on Friday, March 5, 2021, they tendered their resignation, and registered their affiliation with a witch hunter network instead, seeking a more active role in defending the public. I have heard that these new witch hunters have stated their desire to kill OMO's administrators, but I wouldn't take this *too* seriously as a threat; I believe they're at least half-joking, and I take it that OMO's administrators are very powerful and secure indeed. In any case, the Practitioners responsible have been figuratively caught with their pants down; finding suitable long-term replacement guards has proven challenging for them.

- LX - Sea serpent activity deep in the Gulf of Mexico has skyrocketed since the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant attack, including major sea serpent activity. This type of sea serpent activity spike is symptomatic of general disruption to aquatic ecosystems, and is typically associated with major oil spills. Seafaring and navigational Practitioners have been working overtime ensuring that ships travel the safest courses possible. Sea serpent activity has been gradually leveling off since the initial spike, but it's been leveling off to a higher baseline than it started off at.
- LXI - Kokomo, a large island located off the Florida Keys. Kokomo is a Utopia, a supernaturally idyllic place accessible only through the Practice under most circumstances; as with many Utopias, it's used by Practitioners across much of the world both as a vacation spot and as a safe neutral location to hold negotiations and meetings. Although Kokomo is well-defended both by tradition and by its management's resources and connections, its management was apparently spooked by the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant attack, and it went on strict lockdown for a full week afterwards, no one allowed in or out. Although this state of affairs was of course short-lived, Kokomo's security is still in a heightened state; guests must submit to a far more intrusive screening process than they did prior to February of 2021, which has reportedly cut the number of Practitioners and Others willing to make the trip by at least half. The presence of guardian spirits is also felt much more on Kokomo itself; guests feel like they're being constantly watched now, for better or for worse. It's still a valuable meeting ground for many Practitioners, but many are very unhappy with these changes, and quite justifiably so.
- LXII - Goethe State Forest. Home of an old and powerful faerie who goes by too many different names and titles. Somehow, during King Leer's attack in Palmetto, this faerie heard about what was happening and contacted three of the families involved before they had heard about it from anyone else. All three families rejected her offer to aid in fighting off Leer. She took offense to this rejection, although if she has yet acted on this offense, I am not aware of it. I can hardly dispute the judgment of the families involved; accepting free gifts from fae is rarely a good idea.
- LXIII - Domain of the Lord of Orlando. The Lord of Orlando - a Princess who was apparently born to occupy her current position of power - is a good leader, but a conflict-averse one. This is not surprising, given the nature of Princesses as human omens of prosperity and cheerful idealism. Orlando's Lordship is in a very good position to profit at Tampa Bay's expense, as the Lord of the Cape is trying to do. However, the Lord of Orlando has no interest in this - she has a good working relationship with the Lord of Tampa Bay, and she does not want to spoil it. The most Orlando has benefited from recent events is that some toons who no longer feel safe in Tampa Bay's Toontown have moved to the better-established refuge in Walt Disney

World - but that comes with its own obvious complications. In private, the Lord of Orlando has chided the Lord of Tampa Bay for his numerous oversights and moral repugnancies, but she has not pushed the matter. The last few years have been good for tourism in Orlando, owing to many factors but most obviously Universal Studios' Earth Bet area, introduced in 2011. The Lord of Orlando is on edge anticipating a potential tide change, but the long-term ramifications of the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant attack on tourism in Florida are as yet unclear. Certainly, the state has survived many serious crises before, but something does seem obviously different this time.

- LXIV - On Friday, March 12, 2021, a man named Zach Anderson, with no known Awareness of the Practice, was traveling south on I-75. He intended to personally look into the deaths of his estranged wife and two young daughters, who had been among the victims of the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant disaster. He saw a road sign indicating an exit to Still Air Springs, and he took it, perhaps looking for gas. There is no town of Still Air Springs. Three more (apparently unrelated) people took that exit and vanished, before the exit itself faded away later in the day. Expert scourges have been consulted, and their consensus is that Still Air Springs is a "fogstorm" intended for Zach Anderson. Fogstorms are large bubbles of Abyss, customized for a particular target they're intended to ensnare. They're penetrable only for a short window of time, during which they catch their primary target and anyone else so unlucky as to wander in. Afterwards, nothing can get into them until they break and dissipate into the Abyss proper, which can take anywhere from hours to years. Still Air Springs has been active for more than a fortnight now, and we have no idea when it will break or what condition the four humans trapped inside will be in when it does. It is entirely likely that they will all be dead or Otherized; even if they remain alive and human, they will surely be deeply changed by the experience.
- LXV - Jim Dolce, a Heartless Practitioner, lives here, on the shore of Lake Okeechobee. A periodic nemesis of the Lords of Miami, Jim is mostly a harmless eccentric - provided you aren't one of the children he cooks and eats to stay young, and provided that you don't try to get in his way. He notoriously keeps a Familiar in the form of a beetle. He's only lived for about a century and a half in his current residence, but he was already Practicing when he arrived here, and estimates of his true age vary wildly. When he heard that his network of enemies were coming to an anti-internet consensus, he reflexively took the opposite position, to stir the pot, and issued an ominous announcement that he was looking for ways to incorporate technomancy and the internet into his Practice. I am not aware of any internet presence Dolce has, but it's probably worth looking out for him. His pronouncement has (predictably) strengthened the resolve of anti-tech Practitioners.
- LXVI - On Friday, March 19, 2021, in the outskirts of St. Lucie, some type of demon was discovered and reported to the Lords of Miami. It was situated in a false hospital staffed by dopplegangers; it is unclear if this was an illusory projection of the demon or if it was a hollow remnant of what was once a real hospital the demon had infested. The demon was primarily associated with unrecoverable comas, a fate it inflicted on many over an unknown timespan. Although the exact connection remains ambiguous, it seems exceedingly likely that Clearwater's diabolists were responsible for the presence of this demon, and moreover that their recent grabs for power were responsible for at least a considerable portion of the damage the demon has done

here. The demon has since been banished from the area, which would be happy news if not for the fact that it's presumably still on Earth, and we don't know where. There is a rumor circulating that a diabolist banished the coma demon and received a significant payoff from locals, but I am unsure as to this rumor's veracity.

- LXVII - Domain of the Lords of Miami. For many generations now, Miami has been ruled by a duumvirate of Lords, consisting of the heads of each of the city's oldest and most powerful families: the patriarch of the Demosthene family (related to the Demosthenes of Tampa; see XXXVI) and the matriarch of the Blanc family. When they differ, they default to inaction, but they have remained sufficiently close allies that this happens rarely if ever. Following the attack in Palmetto, the Lords of Miami spent some time considering what action to take; they issued the standard boilerplate statement of sympathy, and they sent a token goodwill gift to the Lord of Tampa Bay, but they mostly stayed silent. On Friday, March 12, 2021, they issued a formal proclamation blaming "casual internet Practice" for the tragedy in Palmetto and its fallout, and banning all Practitioners in their territory (covering not just Miami but many nearby cities and communities) from any use of electronic communications indefinitely. These kinds of heavy-handed binding prohibitions are not a new tool in the Miami Lordship's toolbox. Going by precedent, this rule is most likely temporary, and Miami Practitioners can *probably* expect their internet, television, phone lines, and so on back sometime in April, May, or June. Regardless, this is going to be a heavy burden on a lot of people, and they all but called out Occult Magic Online by name.
- LXVIII - The Miami vertex of the Bermuda Triangle, a powerful geographical phenomena known even among Innocent paranormal enthusiasts. (The other two vertices, in Bermuda and San Juan, Puerto Rico, are not pictured, and are located northeast of the map and southeast of the map respectively.) The Bermuda Triangle is a large "seam" in the world, primarily affecting the sea and the sky, where dangerous Others and Practitioners are more powerful and have freer reign. The exact cause of the Bermuda Triangle is unknown, although diabolists have frequently been theorized to be responsible, hence the more illicit and disfavored name "Devil's Triangle". The realm the Bermuda Triangle is most closely related to is the Abyss, although it also has applications for Finders; large geographic triangles are most frequently associated with Astrologers, but the Bermuda Triangle is too dangerous for typical Astrological purposes. After the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant attack, the Bermuda Triangle's vertices started producing spiritual "pulses" or "screams" every eight hours; each vertex pulses every twenty-four hours. These pulses travel at the speed of sound, gradually fading into background noise over hundreds of miles; they are apparently harmless aside from their potential to momentarily distract or startle those able to perceive them. The strength of these pulses has faded considerably through March; they were originally nuisances even in New York City (because of the vertex actually located in Bermuda), but they're now only barely detectable in Florida's panhandle. This phenomenon has one well-recorded historical precedent: the Bermuda Triangle did the same thing during the Cuban Missile Crisis in 1962. (There are well-corroborated, though less detailed, records of the same thing happening several times before the twentieth century, always corresponding to some major regional event, such as the Great Hurricane of 1780.) Going off of this precedent, those with the Sight in Miami can expect to continue hearing these screams daily for years to come.

- LXIX - There's a well-known sorcerer based in Miami who goes by the mononym "Force" or "Fours". I would not be surprised if he were the most powerful individual Practitioner in Florida, and I would certainly put him on the shortlist of likely candidates. He has been a great help in mitigating some of the further-reaching consequences of the attack, and has practically been an unofficial ambassador of Florida in interstate and international negotiations. However, he has maintained neutrality on the cause of the attack. Furthermore, his relationship with his Familiar (an intensely violent greater elemental named Andrew, bound into the shape of an alligator) has been severely strained over this run of activity, and could conceivably collapse. I expect that Force would win a second fight with Andrew. I do not expect that anyone would be better off for such a fight.
- LXX - A section of the kraken population has gradually crept south towards Florida over March. None of the eight individuals involved have been making haste, and the one that's gotten closest is still north of Florida, but they are outside of their normal range, and they are still moving. Krakens are much more worrisome than sea serpents; the greatest of sea serpents are needed to fend off the least of krakens. Sea serpents are aggressively territorial pack hunters, more "bark"; krakens are colossal divine opportunistic predators and scavengers, more "bite". They usually feed on smaller things, like boats or whales, but they are also said to, every few generations, feast on whole islands that have fallen beneath the waves - or, depending on interpretation, *continents*. If they're circling around Florida like vultures, they sense mortal weakness here on a great scale. I think they might think the entire peninsula's going to fall off. Even if the krakens wreak significant destruction first, it will be a huge relief to hear that they're trending north again.
- LXXI - The Martyr family of Alchemists, headquartered in South Bimini, in the Bahamas. Among the world's foremost Alchemists; they own the legendary Fountain of Youth. They're known for the exclusive and expensive resource they offer, useful to all Practitioners but especially as an ingredient in Alchemy, an aqueous solution which has extremely potent healing and anti-aging properties. In March, the Martyrs hiked their already sky-high prices, citing a need to pay for better security; they already had monopoly pricing conditions, even making their clientele swear anti-resale vows, so apparently prices were only as low as they were before in order to build up goodwill. Now, they feel like they need the money more.
- LXXII - Kennedy Space Center, located on Merritt Island. The newest and most significant of NASA's ten field centers, the Kennedy Space Center is first and foremost an Innocent US government facility. However, it is also of great interest to Astrologers the world over, and this pattern has only strengthened over time; the Kennedy Space Center has already accrued an astounding amount of history, and in the more optimistic projections of humanity's future, it's likely to develop much more. This is where men left Earth for the moon four decades ago! This is where a man and a woman are scheduled to leave Earth for the moon several years from now, too. It's easy for us to ignore, but that doesn't mean that it's wise for us to ignore; it's entirely plausible that generations from now, this will be the only point on the map that anyone remembers. On Thursday, March 25, 2021, a group of anonymous Practitioners discovered a very recent attempt by Clearwater's diabolist cabal to infiltrate Kennedy Space Center. They reported this act of treason to Uncle Sam, an Other associated with American nationalism, who had the demon-afflicted employee transferred to

Guantanamo Bay. Everything this employee touched while compromised has been scoured by many Practitioners and Others to minimize potential contamination, but it strikes me as extremely unlikely that the cabal only made one attempt here; it's just that only one attempt has thus far been discovered. This type of activity is not new for this cabal; in the 1970s, they got away with a historic-scale infiltration of the FBI, despite being caught compromising several thousand (!!!) agents. Their interest in Kennedy Space Center is also not surprising; it fits with their theme, which mixes Astrology into their diabolism. They must not be allowed to taint America's space program, which has frankly already suffered enough.

- LXXIII - An aspect of the domain of the Lord of Springfield, a peculiar Lord who rules over a large number of territories of varying sizes spread throughout the world, joined by a liminal space. Her domain is primarily centered in the United States, although this aspect in Florida is not one of the largest (the leading four are in Missouri, Massachusetts, Illinois, and Ohio). Although she's looking for favors - primarily the expansion of Springfield, Florida - the Lord of Springfield has been very helpful in this crisis. She's helped to get Florida's goblins under control in a relatively nonviolent way, and if things turn uglier there, she will be an indispensable resource in pushing back against it. She has provided a safe haven for numerous Innocents who started slipping into Awareness after their tangential involvement in the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant incident. Most critically, she has negotiated for a great Evangelist from Arkansas, John Mark Matthews, to watch over us. JMM has accomplished more great and heroic feats in his time than there are points in this document, any one of which is more laudable than anything I've ever done. I trust him to be a positive influence on us in this time of need, and I can only hope that influence is positive *enough* to get our demon problem under control.
- LXXIV - The Florida Governor's Mansion in Tallahassee. On Sunday, February 28, 2021, Governor Ron DeSantis ordered that, statewide, US and Florida state flags fly at half-staff on Wednesday, March 3, 2021, to honor the victims of the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant disaster, "in which many of those who were killed were killed trying to save others". This is both true and untrue; while it does apply to some of the victims, it's also the excuse Innocents use to explain how some were killed despite never setting foot in the restaurant (as goblins pursued them and dragged them off the streets to their death). The Domain of the Lord of Tallahassee is nearby, but he has not involved himself in this crisis beyond the standard boilerplate statements. For this same reason, I do not place the Lord of Pensacola or the Lord of Gainesville on this map at all.
- LXXV - Johnnie, a sea-serpent-turned-river-monster, named after its home in the St. Johns River. A particularly friendly and gentle Other, popular with Practitioner families with young children; can easily give large parties rides down the river. On Thursday, February 25, 2021, Johnnie began to exhibit numerous signs of severe distress, which have not subsided since. Johnnie has insisted on solitude, ignoring calls and fleeing when approached. It has also frequently been heard moaning, as though ill or in pain. There is no obvious direct cause for this. The St. Johns River has not become more polluted as a consequence of the disaster; it's too far away. As far as we know, Johnnie does not have any direct or close indirect connections to any victims of the attack. It might be reacting to the Bermuda Triangle pulses, but it didn't exhibit similar behavior when the Bermuda Triangle pulsed the same way in 1962, and I haven't been

able to find any comparable Others exhibiting similar behavior *now*. (Sea serpents east of Florida, for example, have only been acting differently lately insofar as they are being directly preyed upon by krakens.) Diagnostic Practices have not proven helpful; a consultant examined Johnnie and merely concluded that it "got a bad feeling about something", a restatement of the original problem. People are worried that Johnnie might be dying, or that it might wind up reverting to a less pacifistic mode of being. I just wish that it could talk and tell us what's wrong.

- LXXVI - There's a section of Lawtey, Florida, that has been cordoned off from the world because a Bixby, Caden Mavis, lives there. Bixbies are, as a rule, best not disturbed; really, they're best not interacted with at all. They aren't nearly so powerful as they think they are, but their delusions of grandeur aren't baseless - the world has dropped some real magical boon on them - and the delusions of grandeur themselves are a source of power. Bixbies innately tend to seclude themselves away from the world, lording themselves over a small group or community; over time, they may become some more stable type of Other, or they may simply fade away, as Practitioners do when they become stuck in their demesnes. Caden Mavis is a relatively benign Bixby, with little desire to leave his hometown, but Bixbies can't really be trusted to stay benign, especially if exposed to external influences. If it comes down to it and a Bixby acts up, they can be put down, but this can easily become more trouble than it's worth. The best course is to aid the world in keeping a Bixby in their own little corner; spirits try to keep these arrangements stable, but they often need help from Practitioners. The news that people receive in Caden Mavis's Lawtey is usually not real news; the news has been run through a spiritual filter that makes it appear as the news from a world that Caden Mavis controls. This is not an uncommon feature of Bixbies' spiritual environments. The trouble is that news pertaining to the Riverhouse Waterfront Restaurant disaster was *not* caught in this filter. It's exceedingly lucky that this was caught in time to prevent it from reaching Caden; the Lord of Jacksonville needed to personally intervene to readjust the filter, which is, for the time being, being supplemented by his own personal power. We don't know exactly what Caden Mavis might have done, had he found out about the events in Palmetto. The fact that he was going to find out about it without active intervention from a Practitioner is deeply concerning; it shows that the ripple effects here are strong enough that they're breaking through conceptual bubbles that are supposed to be resistant to actual major world events.
- LXXVII - The domain of the Lord of Jacksonville, a prodigious and classically-trained augur who has time and time again walked fate perfectly, achieving incredibly improbable victories. When the Lord of Jacksonville learned of King Leer's assault, he immediately understood the nature of the event as apocalyptic, owing to long-term spiraling consequences. (This makes him the third entry in this document to have had this thought - see XVIII, the Schuylers, and LIII, the Ataners.) Hoping to find that this was a mistake or at least receive some clarification, he immediately set to work performing three tests: first, he sacrificed seven sheep without assistance, and he inspected their entrails. Then, he set a pack of seven specially-prepared fireworks alight, and carefully watched them go off. Finally, he released seven caged eagles; it is recorded that when he finished noting down their movements, he said

"Well. Fuck."

I, T.A.A., OMO user LiteralHeadCannon, strongly advise that you do not spend *too* much time worrying about end-of-the-world prophecies. They've been made frequently throughout human history, and we're still here. But I would worry about them *some*. They often portend some more limited or regional cataclysm, which is the main possibility that keeps me up at night here. Worse still, there are demons involved here - whenever that's true, even if the real end of the world does remain billions of years away, outside of the concern of our lifetimes or our children's children's children's lifetimes, careless mistakes can easily move it meaningfully closer. That's why diabolism is a crime against nature, whose punishment we rightly prioritize above all other such crimes. Figuratively speaking, a club has been swung around here, and it's squarely hit a hornet's nest. The Lord of Jacksonville is one of those working around the clock to mitigate the consequences - and he's one of those best positioned to do so - but by and large, you can't unscramble eggs. The hornet's nest remains in pieces; the hornets are out and buzzing and stinging. **Don't let this happen again.**
