- FVEA, New Staff, Curriculum

New Hires to FVE: Mr. Langford 2nd grade, Katie Schoultz SLP, Heather Staples EA IV, Kelly Taylor EA 1. Still need to fill an SSN teacher position.

FVEA provided grants to start the school year and funds to purchase consumable curriculum. Less sections of classrooms allows us to utilize spaces in different ways. Our counselor, ESL teacher and GT teacher have full sized classrooms. We have two staff wellness rooms. We updated our staff lounge with a new countertop and a donated ice maker.

- Enrollment

This year's projection was 384; current enrollment is 368. Depending on October count, we may be paying money back for 12 students. We would be paying back \$63,000 to the district. We have budgeted \$75,000 to cover student count shortage. This contributes to the larger class sizes in our upper grades. In order to keep our Specials teachers full time with our lower student count, we are utilizing them during lunch and recess coverage. Literacy Interventionists are built into the budget with part time positions, and we have added two part time math interventionists.

- School Goals

Three school goals that align with district goals: Literacy (Benchmark Workshop), Social Emotional Wellness (for both students and staff), Professional Learning Communities (keep students at the forefront of all discussions).

- Data: CMAS, School Performance Framework

CMAS scores after three years of pandemic are phenomenal. There is growth across the board. FVE will be submitting a UIP (unified improvement plan) this year. We will base our goals on our CMAS results. This year it will be centered around literacy, specifically writing.

- Funding

District has a bond and mill on the ballot in November. Mill covers staffing compensation and bond provides building maintenance and new construction. If bond passes, FVE would receive new tile flooring, countertops, sinks, replace chiller tower, safety and tech upgrades. DCSD district website has additional information.
