"You can't treat inequity like a monolith. It's not just: Womxn have inequity compared to men. We're done here. You know? When you do that, the womxn who benefit are the womxn of greatest privilege. [Intersectionality] has to be this very deliberate thing built into every moment with constant self awareness."
