Gina Mikel-K(life cycles)

Space Lesson Plan

Supplies:

white paper watercolor pencils small paint brushes water cups paper towels black cardstock glue

Biography:

Gina Mikel is a scientific illustrator. She is married and has two children. She has lived in Austin Texas, Florida and Chicago but currently lives in St Louis on several acres next to a state nature preserve. She draws pictures of plants and and animals for museums, magazines, and science centers. She usually uses colored pencils or watercolors.

Discussion:

- -What is space? the empty area around and within an object
- -Describe positive and negative space. positive space is the object, negative space is the empty area around the object, or the background.
- -Which do you see more of positive or negative space?
- -Does the artwork look flat or dimensional?
- -Discuss the lifecycle of a frog with the students.

Lesson Plan:

- -Using the watercolor pencils the students should draw the outlines of eggs, a tadpole and a frog in different areas of the paper. The students may also draw a lilly pad if they want.
- -They should then carefully dip the paintbrush into the water and "color" the pictures that they drew. The pencil lines will blend together and create a nice painting. Be careful not to use too much water.
- -Mount their pictures on the black construction paper.
