SCHOOL DISTRICT LEGAL STATUS

The legal basis for public education in the Regional School District is vested in the will of the people as expressed in the Constitution of Massachusetts and state statutes pertaining to education.

Under the general Laws of Massachusetts,

"...Every town shall maintain...a sufficient number of schools for the instruction of all children who may legally attend public school therein."

The public education system of the Quaboag Regional School District operates under the provisions of an agreement between the Towns of Warren and West Brookfield, Massachusetts with Respect to the Formation of a Regional School District to be known as The Quaboag Regional School District adopted May 11, 1988. The Regional District schools comprise all grades kindergarten through twelve, inclusive. The School Committee is authorized, at its discretion, to establish and maintain state-aided vocational education, acting as trustees, therefore, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 74 of the General Laws and acts amendatory thereof, in addition to or dependant thereon.
