The assignment is broken down into 4 steps and includes detailed directions. The end product is an email (or other communication) to a teacher you appreciate that includes facts, stats, a personal story, as well as a statement of gratitude.

The steps include:

- Statistics and facts about educational access
- 2. Personal narratives of students around the world
- 3. Drafting the email
- 4. Making edits based on feedback from Mr. A and sending your email
