**POLICE COURT—ADELAIDE.**  
Tuesday, February 12.  
(Before Messrs. H. M. Muirhead, S.M., R. G. Threlton and H. J. Friedrich).  
Horatio Ventris, for whom Mr. L. T. Gun appeared, was charged on the complaint of his wife, with having neglected to obey an order for the maintenance of his four children, made against him on August 20, 1928, under which he was obliged to pay 15/ a week in respect of each of the four children. Mr. J. K. Alderman, of the Children's Welfare and Public Relief Department, applied for the information to be withdrawn, as the arrears, which amounted to £1 10/ in all for each child, had been paid since the charge had been laid. The application was granted. Ventris then made application for the order to be varied. Mr. Gun said three of the children concerned were the defendant's and the fourth was a stepchild. No evidence had been given by Ventris at the hearing at which the orders had been made, and no order had been made in respect of the wife. Ventris had made his wife repeated offers of a home, but they had been rejected. Ventris, in evidence, said his wife had left him with about £45 worth of debts, of which he had paid £15. His wife had refused to accede to his request to return, saying that she was quite happy with the man who was boarding with her. His (the witness's) earnings amounted to £5 13/ a week. Mrs. Ventris said she was living with her children in Stevens-street, Adelaide. She did half a day's washing a week for which she received 6/. She had left her husband because he became drunk and was cruel to her. She refused to go back to him because she was "more comfortable" as she was at present. She was not afraid of her husband. She had taken the children to see him nearly every week until the weather became too hot to take them out, and had not refused her husband access to them. The court reduced the order in respect of each child from 15/ to 12 6.

Thebarton Corporation is calling for tender for the demolition of a 4-roomed cottage on a property at the corner of Dew street and South terrace, Thebarton.

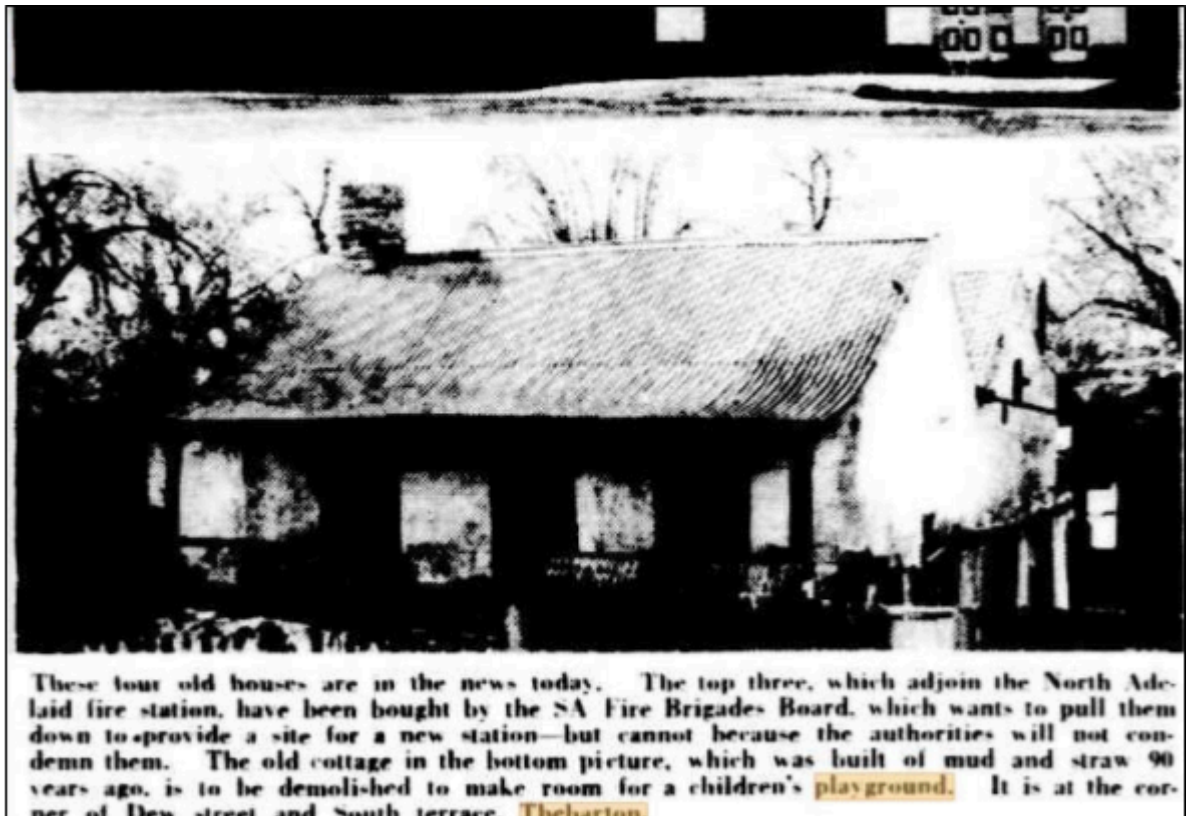
The land, which covers 90 ft. by 104 ft., was acquired by the corporation recently, and will be turned into a children's playground.
