Summary of the Charter of the Unitary Micronations (UM) for New Members

CHARTER OF THE UNITARY MICRONATIONS

Key Principles and Structure

1. Goals and Principles

The UM aims to:

- ✔ Promote cooperation among micronations
- ✓ Encourage cultural exchange and understanding
- ✓ Facilitate peaceful diplomacy and conflict resolution
- ✓ Support humanitarian initiatives
- ✓ Strengthen networking and diplomatic relations
- ✓ Advocate for environmental sustainability

2. Membership

- Founding members: State of Lasetia
- New members must ratify the Charter and commit to its principles.
- Suspension: A member violating UM principles may be suspended or permanently removed by the General Assembly upon the Security Council's recommendation.

3. Governance Structure

The UM consists of two main organs:

✓ General Assembly (all members)

- Discusses international peace, cooperation, and policy matters
- Votes on important decisions (2/3 majority required)
- Elects non-permanent Security Council members

✓ Security Council (15 members, including permanent ones)

- Handles security and conflict resolution
- Makes binding decisions on disputes
- Permanent members have veto power

✓ International Court of Justice

• The judicial body that resolves disputes among members

4. Amendments & Ratification

- Amendments require a 2/3 majority vote in the General Assembly and ratification by permanent Security Council
 members
- The Charter was officially ratified in **February 2025** by key founding members.
