My favourite "touristy" things to do:

- Chinatown -- walk around, eat cheap dim sum from Good Mong Kok bakery
- Coit Tower -- the view is fab, and it's a great walk around North Beach, walk down the 200 steps to the Embarcadero
- City Lights bookstore in Little Italy
- Bike across the Golden Gate Bridge to Sausalito, have a late lunch or early dinner off the main strip (<u>this little pizza place is divine</u>), and take the ferry back to the ferry building
- Visit the sea lions at Pier 39

Underrated - totally underrated!

- Exploratorium -- so much fun and totally underrated
- Hike up Bernal Heights hill to watch the sunset -- less people, more local, similar dope views, plus there's a swing at the top
- Walk along the Embarcadero or grab the F streetcar along to the wharf
- Balmy Alley for graffiti -- there's a lot of Mexican and latin history painted on those walls
- Wander around South Park (original VC area of SF)
- Presidio / Land's End

On par – things that are roughly as great as they're made out to be, expectations on par

- 16th Avenue Steps (beautiful and ig-worthy)
- Palace of Fine Arts = beautiful
- Lombard Street + Ghirardelli Square = I always do these at the same time because they're close together
- Cable Cars! Once you get past the touristy turnaround areas
- SF MoMA
- Sightglass -- great coffee, great atmosphere, overhear lots of VC meetings with founders, an SF staple, ig-worth, no internet, great for meetings
- Philz -- go to the original location at 24th + Folsom in south Mission area
- Bum around the Mission -- meander up or down Valencia, stop into cute shops
- Ferry Building -- it's a hotspot for tourists, but is actually a great place to walk around, and there's a great Saturday morning farmers market.
- Hayes Valley

- Alamo Square for the Painted Ladies
- Dog Eared Books + Alley Cat Books

Overrated – if you really want to do it, go ahead, just know there are better things to do above

- Watch the sunset from Twin Peaks (the classic sunset spot and people drive up)
- Haight Ashbury

Of course, FOOD

Battle of the burritos – everyone has their favourite burrito, but it's generally a toss-up between:

- El Farolito -- 24th + Mission // 24th + Folsom
- La Taqueria -- 26th + Mission
- Pancho Villa Taqueria -- 16th + Mission
- Taqueria Cancun -- 30th + Mission // 6th + Market

More food stuff:

- Jelly Donut -- a small family-owned business. Owns Tim Hortons or Dunkin' anyday. Try the cruller. If the grandma is there, she'll probably throw in 2-3 extra donuts if you're nice. Leave a good tip. *Permanently closed according to Google, and I am SO SAD :(*
- If you're in need of a vegan donut, head down the street to <u>Dynamo Donuts</u>.
- For great asian food, head to the Sunset + Richmond -- <u>House of Pancakes</u> (hand pulled noodles), <u>Yuanbao Jiaozi</u> (dumplings), <u>San Tung</u> (peking duck), <u>Chili House SF</u>. Honestly, you can't go wrong by simply taking to Google Maps and choosing the highest rated thing near you. Keep in mind many places are cash-only. Expect to wait 30–60 minutes at most places during lunch/dinner rush.
- <u>Samovar</u> for chai tea with almond milk
- Mijita (mexican) or Hog Island (oysters!) in the ferry building
- Dosa (Indian), limon rotisserie (Latin America), <u>Hawker Fare</u> (thai) in the Mission + always new restaurants turning over there
- PIZZA -- <u>Tony's slice house</u> or Golden Boy for a quick slice, Tony's sit-down for a meal (I've never actually sat down here but I hear it's the best)
- Isa for ramen
- Chinatown restaurant -- feed a family for \$20 at Yee's
- <u>Blondie's</u> -- the martinis are strong, cheap, and the music is loud.
- <u>Yamo</u> -- 6 seats at the bar. Worth the wait for cheap burmese food. Hole-in-the-wall. Cash only.
- <u>Cha Cha Cha</u> -- GREAT bar that's the centerpiece of this place. Come for the pitchers of margs, stay for the guac and the tipsy vibes.
