NC Objectives (KS2)

Reading:

• Develop positive attitudes to reading and understanding of what they read by increasing their familiarity with a wide range of books, including fairy stories, myths and legends

Writing:

- Draft & write by composing and rehearsing sentences orally (including dialogue), progressively building a varied and rich vocabulary and an increasing range of sentence structures (English Appendix 2)
- Draft & write by organising paragraphs around a theme
- Draft & write narratives, creating settings, characters and plot

Art:

• to improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials [for example, pencil, charcoal, paint, clay]

DT:

• select from and use a wider range of materials and components, including construction materials, textiles and ingredients, according to their functional properties and aesthetic qualities

Music:

• listen with attention to detail and recall sounds with increasing aural memory

Task 1:

Writing: Watch Philip Reeve's clips 'Where is a good starting point?' and 'Where do you start to build your worlds from?' Draw/create/build your own fantasy world. Think carefully about the words and phrases you would use to describe it as you plan. For example, Phillip Reeve created a world based around 'rust'.

Task 2:

Art/Writing: Watch Phillp Reeve discuss what is needed for a description of a fantasy world. Write a setting description of the fantasy world that you created in task 1. Remember to use the five senses to help you describe what the setting is like.

Task 3:

Music: In the extract (Oliver and the Seawigs) it discusses the singing of a particular character as a 'wild crescendo'. Research what this means and find songs with 'wild crescendos' in them. Create a blog to add your bank of songs to.

Task 4:

Reading: <u>Watch Phillip Reeve discuss the importance of the fantasy genre in writing.</u>

Research fantasy stories for 7-10 year olds and create a list of books for you to read over the summer holidays. You could do this with friends and create a 'book club blog' using J2webby where you can share your thoughts and opinions of the texts.
