#Europe 1300-1800's What You Need to Know to Sound Smart

Task: Individually you will read and within a group, you will discuss two documents from the CCHS Library Databases covering a specific topic. Then you find your own library articles to further your learning. After you learn about your topic you will create a Canva presentation with a voice-over recording for the rest of the class to view, take notes on, and be able to answer questions.

Steps:

#1 Reading and Annotating

Individually print and read each document. Annotate your reading (highlight, circle, square, write in margins, etc). *Essential Questions:* What matters? Why or how did this impact Europe or the world? To what extent was this era influential for European and World History?

#2 Find a Third source

Using the <u>research class project page</u> or the book carts, find and cite a third source for your research. Make sure you also cite your first two articles from day 1 in NoodleTools.

#3: NoodleTools Notecards (group)

Create notecards/notecard piles on the following topics:

- 1. What happened?
- 2. Where (maps)?
- 3. When (why are these dates important)?
- 4. Why did it take place (what led to it)?
- 5. What was the impact on Europe (then-later) and the World (then-later)?

#4 CANVA Presentations (group)

As a group, create and share a presentation, then title it with the topic you read about.

Create at least 5-10 slides of information that cover your topic. Bullet Points Only (10 words maximum), but include in-text citations. Focus on the W's who, what, when, where, and why (Why is this important then and later? What did it lead to? Impact?). The last slide is your Works Cited page.

#4 Each Slide must have an image, more is better, that connects to the bulleted information on the slide.

#5 Your group will use **CANVA Presentations** to do a voice-over lecture of the information on your topic. Each person in your group must have a speaking role.

#6 Complete the form to share your presentation.
