	Westword reporter Conor McCormick-Cavanagh tweeted on March 27, 2020, at 10:14 am (ET) “It’s past 8 a.m. local time in Colorado and the Aurora immigration court is still listed as closed. So it’s safe to say, the court is closed today, for a second day in a row.”
EOIR announced via Twitter on March 25, 2020, at 5:49 pm (ET) that "As a precautionary measure, the Aurora, Baltimore, and La Salle immigration courts will be closed tomorrow."	
EOIR announced via Twitter on March 19, 2020, at 2:30 pm (ET) that “Due to inclement weather, the Aurora Immigration Court will be closing four hours early today, March 19.”	Westword reporter Conor McCormick-Cavanagh tweeted on March 19, 2020 at 2:32 pm (ET) “Aurora, Colorado immigration court closing for snow. But aside from weather closure, it’s remaining open, even though unions representing immigration lawyers, judges, and ICE prosecutors are asking for

this court and others to be shut down temporarily to limit spread of COVID-19.”
