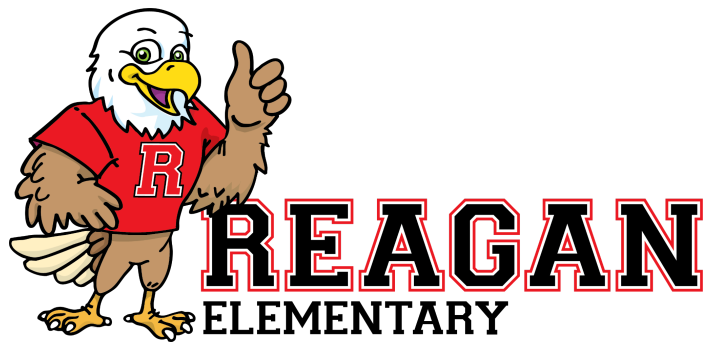

What we are doing at Reagan Elementary to combat bullying

Reagan Elementary Stands Against Bullying

- Reagan is committed to creating a safe and positive environment in our school
- Research supports two key factors in reducing bullying: easy and encouraged reporting and focus on positive bystanders-students who speak up and speak out
- Bullying is prohibited by Millard Public School's standards for Student Conduct

Reagan Elementary educates to prevent bullying and encourages Positive Interactions

- Staff training: All Reagan staff members are trained in recognizing and preventing bullying
- All school expectations will be gone over at the beginning of the year and reviewed over the course of the school year
- Bullying lessons: Our school counselor and teachers teach anti-bullying lessons in the classroom and show students how to report bullying
- BIST (Behavior Intervention Support Team): Outlines school rules, expectations and supports behavior management
- PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports): A research-based framework implemented at Reagan to identify and support positive student behaviors
- Student Recognition: We recognize and celebrate students who display positive peer interactions with Talon Tokens, Positive Office Referrals, and Reagan Students with Heart

Reporting Bullying is Easy

- Reagan pledges to investigate and address each report of bullying
- Students who report bullying will remain anonymous to other students involved
- Bullying can be reported in several ways:
 - Tell a teacher, counselor, administrator, or staff member
 - Fill out a paper or virtual copy of the Bullying Report
 - Come to the counseling or administration office
