28. A student tells a lie to avoid punishment and later feels guilty. Explain how the student can correct the mistake using biblical teachings about sin and repentance.

29. Noah remained faithful to God even when other people did not follow God's ways.

Explain three lessons that young people can learn from Noah.

30. A family is facing difficulties and some members have lost hope. Using Abraham's life as an example, explain how faith can help people during difficult situations.

31. A student is given a responsibility at school but refuses to perform it because it is difficult. What lesson can be learned from Abraham's obedience to God?

32. Two students quarrel and refuse to forgive each other. Explain how biblical teachings can help them solve their disagreement.

33. A young person is pressured by friends to do something wrong. Using biblical teachings, explain five ways the young person can resist peer pressure.

34. A student finds money that belongs to another student. Explain what the student should do and give biblical reasons for your answer.

35. Joseph experienced difficult situations but continued to trust God. Explain three lessons that can be learned from his life.

36. A person becomes successful and begins to look down on others. Using biblical teachings, explain why this behaviour is wrong and suggest better behaviour.

37. A student has been treated unfairly by classmates and wants revenge. Explain how biblical teachings about forgiveness can help the student respond appropriately.

38. A family has a serious disagreement about sharing property. Suggest three biblical principles that can help the family solve the conflict peacefully.

39. A student is given a leadership position in a school club. Explain five qualities of a good leader that can be learned from biblical teachings.

40. Some students believe that success depends only on wealth and material possessions. Using biblical teachings, explain why this belief may be misleading.

41. A student sees another learner being bullied but is afraid to help. Explain what the student can do and relate the answer to Christian teachings about love and helping others.

42. A person repeatedly makes wrong choices and refuses to accept responsibility. Explain the importance of recognizing one's mistakes and seeking forgiveness.

43. A student is struggling with schoolwork and feels like giving up. Using the example of biblical characters who remained faithful during difficulties, explain how the student can develop perseverance.

44. A community is experiencing conflict between different groups. Suggest five ways based on biblical teachings that can promote peace and unity.

45. A student is asked to keep a secret about a friend who has done something harmful. Explain how the student should respond responsibly while applying biblical principles.

46. A businessperson becomes dishonest in order to make more profit. Explain three consequences of dishonesty and suggest biblical principles that can guide the person.
47. A student receives help from a friend during a difficult time. Explain how the student can show gratitude and why gratitude is important in Christian life.
48. A group of students wants to help poor and needy people in their community. Suggest five practical activities they can carry out based on biblical teachings about love and service.
