Introduction:

- Provide examples of how the temporary substitute flexibility provided in the 20-21 and 21-22 school years has helped your district.
 - "Tell the story" of those great subs who you have been able to hire because of the flexibility
 - Provide specific examples of those "rock star" subs; help the committee understand their backgrounds and what has made them good substitutes
 - Share about anything you've done to provide support to these non-traditional subs (orientation, "buddy" teachers or mentors, etc.)
- Explain what will happen in your district next year if you are not able to keep these subs on your substitute list.
- Are there any changes you'd like to see in the legislation? Explain why.
- Acknowledge and thank Representatives Bird and Jones for sponsoring the bill and express how important to have this bill become law before the 22-23 school year begins.
