1. Describe your qualifications for the office you are seeking. Feel free to add anything that you would like for our members to know about you and your candidacy.

I'm a small business owner and a board member of Small Business Forward, a progressive business association. I have owned my business for 15 years and seen much of what current city policies have done in terms of running a small business, cost of living issues, employment, and most alarmingly homelessness. I am of course not a politician and while I can respect policy professionals, it's not my intention to become one.

2. What are the most important short- and long-term solutions to your district's homelessness?

Short term would include city-wide access to supportive housing, and I don't mean shelters. Long term certainly would be to acquire or build housing for working and poor people. The need is great and should be obvious.

3. What work have you done to address economic inequality and housing unaffordability in your district?

As a small business owner, I support organizations that work directly with homelessness. I also offer what little I can to those experiencing homelessness when they visit the cafe.

4. Describe your work addressing racial injustice, economic inequity, and police brutality in your district.

I do what I can to combat racial injustice. That means we don't tolerate it at my business, of course. Economic inequality is best fought on the policy level. It's a large issue that involves income distribution and access to economic opportunities, drivers of inequality as things stand now. As for police brutality, we have a standing policy of not involving police with and problems at my place of business, unless there is a very serious threat of violence, which hasn't as yet happened.

5. How have you supported LGBTQ residents of your district?

You are describing people, humans, all of whom have every right to be who they are. The cafe welcomes all, of course. The cafe also hosts events focused on these groups for political causes. It's a funny thing but I believe that people are people and should be treated with respect and understanding. That is how I support this community.

6. Describe your work addressing the climate crisis.

As with most of the issues brought up in this questionnaire, I haven't worked directly with the climate crisis. I run a small business. To that end, I simply try to be understanding of where and with whom I do business, buy locally, use products that have a lower impact on the environment. I ride a bike when I can.

7. Describe a time when you worked against an established power structure or entrenched authority to achieve a change. How was this change accomplished?

I worked for a nonprofit called Food First in Oakland. We worked with the Immokalee Workers who were tomato pickers subcontracted out to farms that provided tomatoes for YUM Brands. While the Immokalee Workers organized their fight for a boycott against Taco Bell, we helped publicize their fight here on the West Coast, culminating in a rally in front of

YUM Brands in Orange County. This, along with other efforts, led to YUM Brands acknowledging their responsibility to the workers and providing them with the raise the workers demanded.

- 8. There are approximately 16,000 people living with HIV in San Francisco. 74% are over the age of 50. 1 in 6 are unstably housed, at risk of losing their housing, or homeless. In addition, the #1 cause of death among those with HIV in the city is overdose. The Republicans in Congress are looking to cut Ryan White funding by more than half. Given that San Francisco has a world-renowned reputation for providing the best HIV care in the country, how will you identify candidates who would address potential funding cuts, and will you support them?
- 9. In the Presidential election, the Democratic Party lost votes in nearly every county in the nation compared to 2020 results, which played a role in former President Donald Trump's victory. Please elaborate on your analysis on why this happened, and what can be done about it.

The democratic party, and I've voted democratic all my life, abandoned the working class, never followed through with their campaign promises (see Roe vs Wade, Card Check, living wage, healthcare for all, etc.) and have rested their hopes with the billionaire class and Wall Street. In my opinion, and I think this is borne out with Bernie Sander's two campaigns, stop catering to the wealthy and Wall Street, stop accepting buyouts from billionaires and corporations. I'm really not sure how to elaborate on this as it all seems pretty obvious.

10. What is your position on the relationship between the State of Israel and the Palestinian people? What do you see as the role of the U.S. in Israel / Palestine? How should local jurisdictions like San Francisco relate to what is happening in Israel / Palestine? Did you support the 2024 San Francisco Board of Supervisors resolution calling for a sustained ceasefire in Gaza? Please explain.

I do not support genocide. I do not support an apartheid state. My position is the United States is somehow beholden to Israel unlike any other country in the world. Ninety percent of congress is beholden to Israel, arguably more so than they are their own constituents. The U.S. does have the power to enforce the UN agreements for a two-state solution and to enforce the 1967 borders. It's disgraceful that this country spends so much money on another country half a world away while the people of this country suffer so much. So, yes, I support the BoS resolution of 2024 and I think that was the very least San Francisco could do.

11. How would you fight to safeguard California and San Francisco's public education system if the Trump Administration dismantled the US Department of Education? If you could wave your wand and permanently fix the US Public Education System before Trump could dismantle it, what would you create?

I am not sure how I would, or could, fight to safeguard the public education system both in the city and state-wide as we don't actually know if it's possible for Trump to dismantle it without congressional approval. And I really don't know much about how that process might work. However, the threatened loss of public education in the United States would profoundly change the structure and nature of this country and would require every tool possible to defeat.

Ideally I'd make public education from preschool to post-doctorate a constitutional right for every citizen, free and funded by appropriate taxation. Look, if this country can spend a trillion dollars on militarily dominating the world, why not cut that by nine-tenths and fund the necessities here in this country; education, healthcare, housing, infrastructure.

I've lived in what used to be District 5 for 25 years. It's now District 7. That is the effect of redistricting.
