An Incubation Lab for Innovative Community Ideas

An incubation lab would empower residents, particularly those from marginalized communities, to turn their ideas into actionable initiatives. From youth programs to policy

reforms, this lab would foster creativity and collaboration, ensuring that the city's future is shaped by those most impacted by its challenges.

A Community Leadership Council to Foster Unity and Transformation

A community leadership council would bring together diverse voices—from residents and activists to business and civic leaders—to identify needs, set priorities, and advocate for systemic change.
