1. How does God interact with Abraham?
2. How does God interact with Sarah?
3. How does God interact with Lot?
4. How does God interact with the townsmen of Sodom?
5. How does God interact with Lot's wife?
6. How does Sodom's sin affect Lot?
7. How does Sodom's sin affect Abraham?
8. How does Sodom's sin affect Lot's wife?
9. Why do you think Lot's wife "looks back"?
10. How does Lot's wife's disobedience affect her family?
11. How does Lot's choice to live in Sodom affect his family?
12. How does Lot's choice to live in Sodom affect his uncle, Abraham?
13. What does the "negotiation" between Abraham and God reveal about God's nature?
14. What does God's choice to tell Abraham "what he is about to do" to Sodom and Gomorrah reveal about God?
15. What does God sending 3 angels to Abraham and Sarah reveal about his nature?
16. What do those angels reveal to Abraham and Sarah?
17. Looking at the whole Sodom and Gomorrah story, do you think it was just for God to destroy them? (Yes or No) What does this reveal about the nature of God?
