Steps to Completing College Applications			
 Complete the appropriate application(s) for the colleges or universities you wish to apply before the deadline. Request letters of recommendation (if required) as soon as possible: Please use the <u>Brag Sheet</u> & letter request link. Finalize essays and resume. Order transcript through <u>Parchment</u> at least two weeks before the college application deadline and no later than November 12 for 			
December 1 deadline. If you are applying to an Honors College at a particular college or university then a recommendation letter may be required. This letter is usually required to be written by a student's core teacher. Again, check the school's website for details. Leander ISD does not send test scores. Request ACT/SAT scores to be sent directly from the testing company to applicable schools.
