Why This Campaign Is Needed Now

 A successful reproductive justice movement is rooted in our ability to join together all people, all bodies, all minds to demand that all of our reproductive needs be met and no one is left behind. We are strongest with the leadership of the most oppressed, who experience the system at its worst and for that reason keep the movement focused on the long-term, multi-faceted fight.

 We encourage all individuals and organizations in the struggle for reproductive rights to see the battle for immigrant justice as your own fight! When we support and amplify immigrant rights activists, we also uplift the particular issues of parents, pregnant people, children, disabled individuals, and trans people in the demands they put forward.

 This campaign also celebrates the resistance happening all over the country! We can motivate more people to move to action through showing how many of us are already showing up in protest and solidarity.

"A two-month-old baby boy suffered respiratory distress while held at the Dilley Family Detention Center in Texas, operated by a for-profit company. According to Congressman Joaquin Castro, the infant became unresponsive, and there was no doctor available when staff tried to seek help. An ambulance took him to the hospital where he recovered but the family was later deported to Mexico."—Scripps News

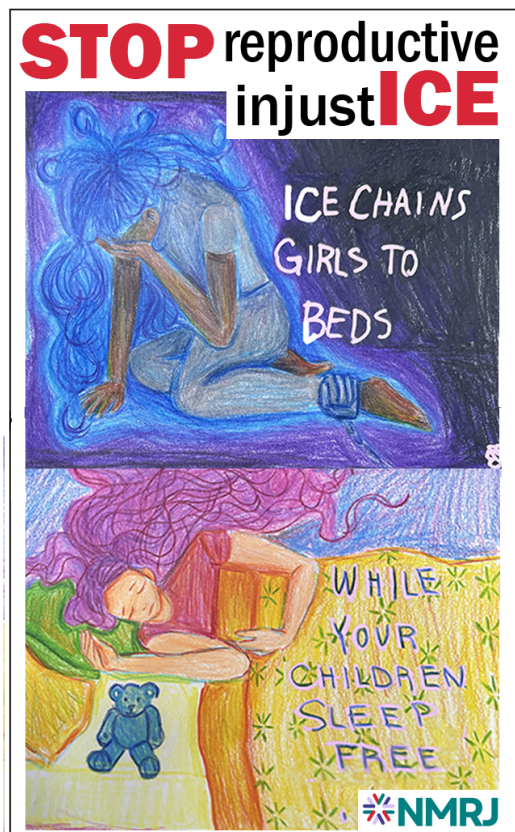

On May 8, 19-year-old Olivia Andre, who fled with her family from torture and abuse in the Congo, was released from Dilley Immigration center in Texas after six months.

The nursing student from Maine had been separated from her mother and two younger siblings who were released in March. The shackles she was forced to wear for long periods left scars on her wrists and ankles. Mental scars include insomnia, nightmares, depression and PTSD.

Release came after a federal district court ruled that Andre's continued detention violated her constitutional right to due process.

From 1/1/25 to 2/16/26, DHS reported 363 pregnant, postpartum and nursing immigrants were deported, and 16 detainees had miscarriages.

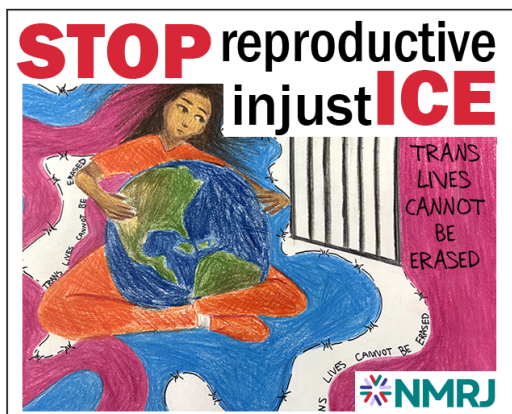

STOP REPRODUCTIVE INJUSTICE! STOP ICE!

Trans people are suffering inhumane conditions and abuse in U.S. immigration detention, including those with dedicated units for trans people. They are held significantly longer than average. They face high rates of sexual assault, unsafe housing conditions, and denial of medically necessary care including for mental health, HIV and hormone therapy. Under the Trump regime, no records are kept on trans people in detention.

STOP REPRODUCTIVE INJUSTICE! STOP ICE!

Diana Santillana Galeano was detained by ICE on Nov. 5 at the Rayito de Sol Early Learning Center in Chicago as children were being dropped off. Officers grappled with her at the front door as parents gathered.

In July 2025, agents confronted a man outside his child's preschool near Portland, Oregon, with many children looking on. In Los Angeles, agents handcuffed a disabled teen near a high school campus. In October, ICE tear gas engulfed a Chicago elementary school playground during school hours.

Keep kids, parents and teachers safe from ICE!
Make schools and childcare centers safe havens!
Abolish ICE!
Stop attacks on immigrants!

STOP REPRODUCTIVE INJUSTICE! STOP ICE!

In February, ICE seized 5-year-old Liam Conejo Ramos and used him as bait to capture his father, Adrian Conejo Arias, a Colombian immigrant. They were sent from Minnesota to Dilley Family Detention Center in Texas, drawing world attention. The judge who ordered their release after 10 days condemned the detention as driven by "perfidious lust for unbridled power".

In March, an immigration judge threw out the family's asylum claim and ordered the immediate deportation of Liam, his brother, father, and pregnant mother. An appeal is underway.

As Black abolitionist Frederick Douglass replied when asked the meaning of July 4th to an enslaved person: “A day that reveals ... the gross injustice and cruelty to which he is the constant victim. To him, your celebration is a sham; your boasted liberty ... a thin veil to cover up crimes.”

So it is today. Black immigrants are deported at higher rates than other immigrants, even though they are more likely to be authorized. They make up only 5.4% of the undocumented population, but are 20.3% of those facing removal based on criminal convictions. Black detainees are 24% of people held in solidarity confinement and have increased risks of physical and emotional abuse. All factors are compounded for Black LGBTQ migrants.

STOP REPRODUCTIVE INJUSTICE! STOP ICE!

When ICE seizes immigrant caregivers it puts multiple lives at risk.

In October 2025, Maher Tarabishi, originally from Jordan, was detained at a routine immigration check-in. He had lived legally in the U.S. for 17 years as the primary caretaker for his son, Wael, who had a severe degenerative disability.

ICE accused Tarabishi of being a “criminal alien” and past member of a terrorist organization. Without Maher, his loving and skilled care provider, Wael declined rapidly. He was hospitalized with severe infections and died January 24. ICE refused to let Maher visit or attend his son’s funeral. Maher decided to self-deport to Jordan.
