Tennyson: An Excerpt from Sky and Otter's Handbook to the Fae, Chapter Three, Page Sixteen. The common pixie is usually very small, very loud, and very irritating.

They pose about as much of a threat to human beings as the average North American bee, but can be deadly in large swarms.

Tennyson: Hi, I'm Tennyson, and welcome to the weirdest podcast on the internet.

Alder: You don't know that.

Tennyson: I mean, it's pretty likely.

Alder: You haven't listened to every single podcast ever made.

Tennyson: Alder and I run a supernatural investigations service out of our crappy RV. We travel all around North America solving people's strangest problems.

Alder: And yes, that does include Mexico.

Tennyson: Also, before you ask, no, we aren't using our real names.

Tennyson: The Game: A common euphemism for fae politics. Used to refer to both individual ambitions and [crossfade Tentative into Who We Are by Coldnoise] collective machinations of entire courts. See also playing.

Tennyson: No, I didn't tell her. I mean, I told her I talked to you, but not what you said.

Tennyson: Initiated: Generic term for half-fae or Sighted human individuals. Does not typically include the fae, but is occasionally used by them as a sort of slur.

Alder: I don't think I lived up to his expectations.

Tennyson: You don't get to decide what I'm ready for.

Alder: I mean, we're both pretty bad at communicating, so we might just be screwed. We'll see.

Tennyson: Don't turn around. Don't even twitch.

Tennyson: Affiliated: Used to refer to fae and humans alike, though usually in the context of fae political structures. Generally describes a person who is under the protection of a larger group, like a court or a network of initiated.

Magpie: Fine. If my help makes you feel unprofessional, I'll just find it for you. Here.

Tennyson: Are you trying to use my guilt? Because that is low.

Alder: You've been withholding the important details lately.

Tennyson: I think your secrets might be hazardous to my health.

[Who We Are reaches peak and fades out]

Tennyson: Affiliated. Adjective. Closely associated with another typically in a dependent or subordinate position. Synonyms: akin, allied, kindred, related.

[Sound of car engine]

Alder: Ten —

Tennyson: I didn't say anything!

Alder: You wanted to.

Tennyson: Is that a crime?

Alder: Just drive.
