There are three sets of news release templates in this document, based on the following scenarios:

- <u>Scenario A</u>: The district is able to welcome back all students into its buildings and resume a mostly normal school day schedule.
- <u>Scenario B</u>: The district can welcome back students into buildings with a staggered schedule (e.g., A/B days).
- <u>Scenario C</u>: The district begins the school year delivering all instruction remotely. Students and staff do not report to the school buildings.
