Many youth take pictures/videos of themselves and send them to friends or post the content online – you are likely no different. Sometimes, the content may end up on the Internet without your permission. When this happens, removing the picture/video is often a primary focus. If you know where your picture/video has been posted, you can try to take steps to get it off the Internet.
