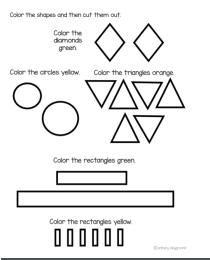

Library

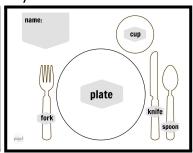
